

January 1, 2023 SOLEMNITY OF MARY, THE HOLY MOTHER OF GOD

FROM OUR PASTOR

Happy New Year! What does a happy new year look like for us? Why be happy and what is new? While you ponder that, let's not forget that we as a people of faith also celebrate the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God. It's a great idea to start the new year with Mary, asking for her intercession and to be with us each moment of the way in 2023.

The prayers and preface for that Mass are the following.

Opening Prayer: O God, who through the fruitful virginity of Blessed Mary bestowed on the human race the grace of eternal salvation, grant we pray, that we may experience the intercession of her, through whom we were found worthy to receive the author of life, our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son.

Prayer over the gifts: O God, who in your kindness begin all good things and bring them to fulfillment, grant to us, who find joy in the Solemnity of the holy Mother of God, that just as we glory in the beginnings of your grace so one day we may rejoice in its completion.

Preface: For by the overshadowing of the Holy Spirit she conceived your Only Begotten Son, and without losing the glory of virginity, brought forth into the world the eternal Light, Jesus Christ our Lord.

Prayer after communion: We have received this heavenly Sacrament with joy, O Lord: grant we pray, that it may lead us to eternal life, for we rejoice to proclaim the blessed ever Virgin Mary Mother of your Son and Mother of the Church.

May these prayers help you to enter more deeply this great feast day and help you come ever closer to Jesus through Mary. So that throughout the new year, your relationship with Jesus will be strengthened and become more passionate for Him as He is for you.

It is also World Day for Prayer for Peace. The following prayer (Prayer to the Prince of Peace, for the family) was written by the Sisters of Life.

"O Jesus, King of the World. You entered our lives hidden and humble in a Bethlehem Cave. Now, hidden in the Host, You come.

O Jesus in the Eucharist, let the rays of Your love flood my soul, and the soul of every person in my family. With Your saving power, Jesus, cast out all anxiety, unforgiveness, addiction, pride, impurity, confusion, hatred, and despair. Pierce the darkness with Your light and fill us with Your Presence.

O Jesus in the Eucharist, King filled with compassion, Come reign in my family.

O Jesus in the Eucharist, King of infinite mercy, Come reign in my family.

Mary, Mother of God, St. Joseph, protector of the Holy Family, Help us to love Jesus and to entrust ourselves completely to Him.


