

January 9, 2022 BAPTISM OF THE LORD

We are Christians with an Indelible Mark

As the festive time with Christmas Season passes, we are stepping into Ordinary Time with the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Another change of season in the liturgical year. The first part of Ordinary Time will continue eight weeks until we start the season of Lent with Ash Wednesday on the 02^{nd} of March 2022.

As we celebrate the feast of the Baptism of the Lord, it is a reminder of our own baptism and the indelible mark that we have received with the above sacrament. This indelible mark of the cross, placed upon our foreheads, can never be erased. As per the Modern Catholic Dictionary by Fr. John Harden, "the sign is indelible because it remains even in a person who may lose the state of grace or even the virtue of faith. It perdures at least until death and most likely into eternity". It further says, "The indelible sign is imprinted on the soul when the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Priesthood are received". They are sacraments received once for our life time.

In short, the sacramental character assimilates a person to the priesthood of Christ. Hence from this primary function, the secondary functions flow, in increasing order of sublimity, from Baptism through Confirmation to Holy Orders. As we are reflecting on vocation to priesthood and religious orders this weekend, we need to realize that Baptism is the base for this journey.

A catholic priest from Malaysia briefed the concept of Baptism in one of his homilies. As for him, Baptism is,

God moves in → Cleanses our sins → Marks us for Him → Gives His life → Members of Christ → Heavenly Right

Do this make any sense?

Each phrase is food for thought reminding us of our baptism and how we become children of God.

Dear Children, do we really value the precious gift you have received through your baptism?

Dear Parents & God Parents, do you remember the promises made of the day of your children's baptism?

Dear Youth, Are you aware of the task given to you through your baptism?

Let's do bit of a home work.
