

January 15, 2023 SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDIARY TIME

FROM OUR PASTOR

Welcome to Ordinary Time. What happens in Ordinary time? I always think it is a great time to meet the saints. We have memorials and optional memorials of the saints during the liturgical year. So what does that mean? Glad you asked! Each saint has an established feast day. Usually it is the day they died or were martyred. Depending on the importance of the saints or connection to a nation or people, it may be a memorial or optional memorial.

For example St. Francis of Assisi is celebrated by the whole church around the world on October 4th. So that feast day is on the universal Church calendar. Recently we celebrated the feast of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton on January 4th. As a founder of catholic schools in the United States her legacy has been huge the last 200 years. Because of her, we have a school here in Mauston. But the rest of the world may or may not (optional) celebrate her feast day. With thousands of canonized saints they would not all fit on a yearly calendar to be celebrated by all. So some are regional or like Blessed Michael J. McGivney, he is celebrated anywhere by the Knights of Columbus who are all over the world.

How do we meet them? One way is at daily Mass where we celebrate their feast day. Daily readings for their Mass can help us. Of course you can google them. There are many apps that bring you the saint of the day. There are many saints books waiting to be read. Or the history of your parish, the saints in the windows or statues you find inside a church.

Or run into them as I have done. I was with a group in Rome. One of the afternoons was free for us to wander around and see what we wanted. A few of us went to the Piazza Navona to people watch enjoying some Italian wine. After a while we noticed a building open that people were going into that hadn't been open during the days we were there. So we were a little curious and went over. Through the entrance, down a hallway, down some stairs all lit by candles and a few lights. Into a small room which was a chapel. There near the middle was a skull in a silver case on a pedestal. Soon we figured out that it was St. Agnes. The church we entered was St. Agnes in Agone. It was her feast day and people were invited to come into the chapel to venerate her relics. The most famous being her skull that was preserved after her martyrdom. So that was a surprise and a chance to ask for her intercession on her feast day.

Saints are not just from the early Church. A group of us seminarians in 1998 were able to be a part of the morning Mass in the papal chapel. Often in the mornings Pope (now St.) John Paul II allowed small groups to join him for morning Mass if he didn't have major ceremonies that day. So after Mass we were able to meet him and have our picture taken with him. He was in a very good mood and was twirling his cane around waiting for our group to get organized. So it is very possible to meet a saint. Or perhaps their family. There have been a few conferences in our diocese where St. Gianna Beretta Molla's daughter came to speak about her mother who is a canonized saint.

It is possible to go to shrines of the saints where they have been laid to rest. Often for World Youth Days certain patron saints have been brought to be a part of the celebration and a means of veneration so our young people can get to know these saints up close and more personally. Medals and prayer cards keep the saints close to us throughout the day. Youtube also has a great deal on the saints that make them that much more real and not simply a legend from ages ago. The saints in the end are our elder brothers and sisters in the faith. Invite them into your journey of faith so that you can join them forever. Ordinary time does not have to be boring or even that ordinary when traveling with the saints back to our heavenly home land.




