

January 20, 2019 SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FROM OUR PASTOR:

Around the country there are many Walks for Life going on. The largest walk that will not receive much media time will be in Washington D.C.. I have been there a few times for that. The National Shrine is filled shoulder to shoulder with people for the Mass. How a few hundred thousand people gather year after year so peacefully without any coverage is a miracle!?? I know that members of the parish will be part of the Walks for Life in different parts of the country. If you can, I encourage you to participate in our local one here in Mauston.

From 40 Days for Life magazine I wish to share with you the following story in summary.

"Katie Seim is a junior at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. It wasn't until she was in high school that Katie really knew anything about abortion and the pro-life movement. By happy coincidence, her mother was late picking her up from sports practice on the same day that the 40 Days for Life kickoff rally was going on nearby. Katie stopped by and was hooked.

As she was only 15, Katie had to convince her mother to drive her to the 40 Days for Life vigil, where her life would be changed forever. Barely knowing how to pray herself, Katie decided to simply hold a sign on the sidewalk that day: Pray to end abortion.

But then, something shocking happened. A man pulled over next to the sidewalk and spat out, "I hope you get raped!" At that moment, Katie understood the evil of abortion and launched into a journey of faith and the mission to protect the unborn, whatever the cost.

"The world tells us that there is no absolute truth and I was really comfortable with that. Thinking that way was really easy, she said but 40 Days for Life ruined that mindset for me. There are objective truths and no one was willing to fight for them. So I took it upon myself."

Katie founded one pro-life student organization and helped lead two others. She led a weekly prayer group outside of Planned Parenthood in Lincoln, during the entire school year.

She has not limited herself to fighting abortion, but also addresses pro-life issues in a broader sense by volunteering to assist with refugee families, and at a woman's shelter and at a home for elderly people with Alzheimer's. Most importantly, Katie's work to defend life has led her into a personal relationship with Christ. Katie is pursuing a degree in Business Administration and hopes to work full time in the pro-life movement when she graduates."

Lets not underestimate what our young people can do. May we pray for them and where God is calling them to serve the kingdom where He reigns as the Way, the Truth, and the Life.
