FROM OUR PASTOR:

Getting away allows you to look more deeply at things and reflect on them. As I write this I am looking at sunshine and palm trees and thinking what I am returning to?!

Our first day of Mass and holy hour opened space for the Holy Spirit to speak.

I wish to share with you a longer quote from Dr. Mary Healy. "The absence of God in our society leaves an inner void that people seek to fill with all kinds of counterfeits. There is a growing culture of narcissism, in which the highest values are ascribed to self-fulfillment, physical attractiveness, sexual freedom, and the accumulation of possessions. These empty pursuits have in turn led to a landscape of broken relationships, broken lives, loneliness, addiction, and the whole array of societal evils that St. John Paul II summed up as 'the culture of death."

God is good, so we didn't stay with that thought for too long.

Our readings for Mass lifted us up. Hebrews told us, "Jesus likewise shared in them, that through death he might destroy the one who has the power of death, that is, the Devil, and free those who through fear of death had been subjected to slavery all their life."

Jesus is always our hope. There can be many things broken in our lives, but God offers us more. He takes us beyond our limits.

Mark 1:29-39 was our Gospel reading. It brought it all together. Jesus heals and lifts up. He drives out demons. He gives the example of prayer and from that reached out. He knows His purpose.

Stepping out of our daily routine can help us do the same. Where do we find our breaks? When we step back from work, what refreshes us? Restores hope, strength, and zeal in following Jesus?
