Every child has to go through schools of faith and human values along with the formal education. We believe that, life begins with conception. The faith and the attitude of every expecting mother gives an initial formation to the child to be born.

The family is the second or the **next school of formation** for a child. Every single act performed by the family members become the primary lessons in the beginning stage of formation.

Intimately linked in charity to one another and to their students and endowed with an apostolic spirit, May teachers by their life as much as by their instruction bear witness to Christ, the unique Teacher."

As the journey of formation continues, there is another platform a child sees the wider picture of the world, the **school of society**. A huge number of stakeholders make an impact in the formation of the child in this school. Among many stakeholders, parish community plays a major role as an individual and as organized groups towards the formation process. Are we ready to take up the challenge?
