FROM OUR PASTOR:

Well I guess it is winter. But what a way to start Catholic Schools Week!! We can not underestimate what a blessing and resource our parish school is. How many generations have been formed in the faith, a faith they lived out their whole lives. Investing in our school pays dividends for decades. It is one of the things families mention all the time as I prepare for a funeral of a loved one. How they went to school here. How it laid a foundation that they built their lives on. If you get a chance, thank our teachers, those forming our young people now and those who were a part of laying the foundation in the past.

Reflecting on our faith, let's look at the month of February and those who have lived and given us a witness to the faith over the centuries.

February 2 is the feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the temple. Always good to start with Jesus. Even as a child God is doing amazing things, whether in the womb or in the arms of Mary. A reminder our society needs. We move on to martyrs who witnessed with their blood. St. Agatha was a young girl with great courage and firmness of heart to follow boldly our Lord to the amazement of those around her. St. Paul Miki suffered long and very publicly for Jesus in a land that saw Christianity as something very foreign and a source of corruption for society.

St. Josephine Bakhita is a wonderful story. What a hard life, sold into slavery as a child and the courts deciding if she had value as a person or property. An issue the courts have not yet figured out for the unborn. FORMED has a great movie on her life, I highly encourage you to watch it. It is very moving.

Who has not been hurt in some fashion? Our Lady of Lourdes reminds us of the healing power of God and Mary's role in it. Lourdes often invokes the idea of miracles. About seventy have been "proven" miracles while tens of thousands have been reported over the years. Offering a Rosary this month for the intention of those who need healing would be very appropriate.

The 14th is actually the feast of Sts. Cyril and Methodius who spread the Gospel and the love of God. St. Peter Damian is a doctor of the church because of his writings and teaching of the faith. We celebrate the feast of the Chair of St. Peter, a good day to offer prayers for Pope Francis. Then we conclude the cloud of witnesses in February with a martyr, St. Polycarp. He knew St. John who walked with Jesus. That sense of giving witness to who we know, Jesus, and how that is passed on by the living out of the faith. Which is what we began with as we acknowledge the value of our Catholic school and faith.

May we keep our young people in prayer as they grow in faith because of our witness as we all strive to become the saints that our heavenly Father wants us to be.

- 19% of 18-24-year-olds have sent a sext.
- 21% of minority youth in 10th grade have sent a sext.
