FROM OUR PASTOR

Love is in the air!! Or at least on Friday, anyway! Hope your Valentine's Day was a good one. Valentine's Day is often seen as a day to give chocolate or pick out the card that says just the right thing, or send roses. Or anything else Hallmark is trying to get you to buy. As Catholics, we remember that day is named after a saint.

St. Valentine was a martyr. In the early church it was still illegal to practice the faith. He was arrested, sent to prison and because he kept the faith he was killed for it on Feb. 14th. His legend contains many stories of miracles, acts of charity to couples preparing for marriage and his own courage facing death. As you may have guessed he is the patron saint of engaged couples, happy marriages, love and lovers. He is also the patron of beekeepers, epilepsy, fainting, plague, travelers and greetings.

We hear from St. John's gospel "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends." John 15:12.

St. Valentine did exactly that. He witnessed the faith by shedding his blood. It was his love of Jesus that moved his heart. The scriptures come alive for the saints. They allow it to deeply enter their hearts to shape and form their activities.
