FROM OUR PASTOR:

This weekend is the last week of Ordinary time. Wednesday is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the season of Lent. February 11 is the feast day of Our Lady of Lourdes. Known also as the World Day of the Sick. A reminder to pray for those who are ill and suffering long term sickness. Pray for and visit those who may not be able to get out because of their illness. Mary visits those who would never expect a visit from someone important. Not just a visit but usually then a call into service. That they are not forgotten or too little or of no importance. Perhaps at times we need to hear that same message. We can get down on ourselves and wonder why or why bother? Or we can get down on others and put them down in word or deed. Yet our heavenly Father has plans for all of us no matter how we see ourselves at a particular moment.

Lent culminates with Holy Week and the passion, death, burial and resurrection of our Lord Jesus. To reflect on those events we will be offering the Stations of the Cross at a number of times this season. The school children will be praying them in the afternoons, watch for the exact times in later bulletins. Those and the shadow stations are open to the parish. On the week ends, Stations will be before the 5 pm Mass at 4:30. Then on Sunday they will be offered at 9:30 am. New this year will be a change on Fridays for adoration. We will have adoration at 4 pm to 5 pm. Then at 4:30 we will offer the Stations of the Cross. I hope that some of our families or those coming from work can make the Stations as a family. Also a great time to pray together in a special way this Lent.

On Ash Wednesday we will hear from the readings about prayer, fasting and almsgiving; which are the "standard tools" of Lent. Let's take some time and consider how we will live those out. Part of our thoughts should be how will our Lenten prayer, fasting and almsgiving bring us into a closer relationship with Jesus? Simply giving up candy for example, how does that move our hearts to love God and neighbor all the more?

There are moments of celebration in the season of Lent also. Don't forget St. Joseph's feast day. Here at St. Patrick's we also have the Gala coming up. We will be sending our two candidates down to La Crosse for the Rite of Election. That is one of the big steps of the RCIA program we have here and I hope you are praying for them in their final months of preparations. May we all embrace Lent as that time to deepen our journey of faith coming closer to our Lord by our love and service of Him and our neighbor.

LENTEN REGULATIONS

The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 14th.

Lenten regulations are as follows:

- 1. Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday.
- 2. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may eat only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.


