

February 12, 2023 SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FROM OUR PASTOR

Ash Wednesday and the season of Lent will soon be upon us. The question of "what are you giving up for Lent?" What will you sacrifice in this season of conversion is a question we will all need to address. Sacrifice, offering something up; what does that mean exactly? In the natural realm the sense is no, you don't have it or do it and that is the end of the story. But when we look to the spiritual realm, the practice of our faith, there is a much richer sense of sacrifice. The Second Vatican Council spoke of the sacrifice of the Mass and the call to fully participate in it; to exercise the common priesthood of all the baptized. In the coming weeks I will be working with an article, "Sacrifice: Path to Communion" from the Catechetical Review (October-December 2022) edition. The author is Andre Villeneuve the Associate Professor of Old Testament and Biblical Languages at Sacred Heart Major Seminary in Detroit Michigan. I will be breaking the article up into smaller pieces for us to reflect upon and help us to understand the word "sacrifice" in its fullest sense and meaning in our faith and its roots in the Old Testament. Yes that does seem like a lot, but we do need to stretch ourselves to grow in the faith and understanding of where we have come from as a people of faith.

"The great mystery of Christ's sacrifice for us is at the heart of the Christian faith:' For Christ, our Paschal Lamb, has been sacrificed' (1 Cor. 5:7). As the Catechism explains, Jesus' death manifests his sacrifice in two ways: Christ's death is both the *Paschal sacrifice that* accomplishes the definitive redemption of men, through 'the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world,' and the *sacrifice of the New Covenant*, which restores man to communion with God by reconciling him to God through the 'blood of the covenant, which was poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins.' (CCC 613) Thus, the two principal effects of Christ's sacrifice are, first, to remove our sins, and second, to restore communion with God. Transformed by this gift of divine love, we are called to imitate Jesus and 'walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God' (Eph 5:2) Indeed, the Church teaches that every baptized Christian participates in Christ's sacrifice (CCC 618). We are especially joined to it in the sacrament of the Eucharist, which makes Christ's sacrifice of the cross, because it is its *memorial* and because it *applies* its fruit' to our lives by taking away our sins and restoring communion with God. The problem is that for most people today, the biblical notion of sacrifice seems obscure. What does sacrifice in general, and Christ's sacrifice in particular, really mean? And how do the sacraments-especially Reconciliation and the Eucharist-manifest the Lord's sacrifice? The best way to gain insight into these questions is to consider the symbolism of the sacrifices in the Old Testament."

That first part then sets up our question and calls us to think more deeply about what we do each time we come to Mass. It will also help us come to know more deeply a biblical sense of what we are called to do at each Mass we attend and are to enter more deeply into the mystery of God at work for our salvation. So please take these coming reflection points and allow them to help you prepare for the Lenten season. But also prepare yourself to enter the Mass in a whole new way. During the week I encourage you to pray over the tests we will be using and open an avenue for the Holy Spirit to fill you with wisdom and knowledge on something we do so often we may take it for granted or do out of routine.
