FROM OUR PASTOR

Having just celebrated St. Valentine's Day I would offer some advice from the book, "101 Tips for a Happier Marriage." No matter our situation we can always use encouragement. It is good to know that others are in our corner. As a parish, let us pray for all of our married couples.

- -- Picture yourself satisfied with life and happy to be alive, focusing on what you do have rather than what you don't. People divorce because they believe it will make them happier. Instead of dwelling on the traits you wish your spouse had, try thinking about the positive traits that made you fall in love in the first place. Odds are that he or she hasn't changed that much.
- -- Picture yourself living to a ripe old age. For men, divorce is about as dangerous as picking up a pack-a-day cigarette habit. Being unmarried shortens a woman's life span by more years than having cancer or living in poverty. The bottom line here is clear: Your marriage matters--not just to your children and friends who need your good example, but also to yourself. If you're not trying to make it work for others' sake, can you at least do it for yourself? If your marriage is on the rocks, seek help and don't give up.
- -- Imagine your child's graduation from high school. You're proud of them. You're proud of yourself and your spouse because you know you have contributed to their success. Children of married parents are more likely to finish high school, go to college, and have good grades than are children of divorced parents. Sometimes divorcing couples say all they have in common anymore is the kids. As important as your children are, your spouse still comes first. Make time alone with each other a priority in order to strengthen your relationship. Then, not only will you have raised great, well-adjusted kids, but, by your example, you will help them provide you with great grandkids.
- -- Imagine your child's (or future child's) wedding day. The bride is radiant. The groom is confident. They are both hopeful. Children of divorced parents have more difficulty trusting others and forming lasting relationships, and are more likely to get divorced themselves. The foundation for happily married couples begins with happily married parents. Instead of watching the divorce rate rise, let's help young people by demonstrating a more positive trend--life long marriage.

A word of encouragement from the Roman Ritual: the Order of Celebrating Matrimony #9. "Through this Sacrament, the Holy Spirit brings it about that, just as Christ loved the Church and gave himself up for her, Christian spouses also strive to nurture and foster their union in equal dignity, mutual giving, and the undivided love that flows from the divine font of charity. In this way, uniting divine and human realities, they persevere in good times and in bad, faithful in body and mind, remaining complete strangers to any adultery and divorce."

As we can see, and many have experienced, marriage is not easy and needs prayer but is a pathway to holiness & love in ways not expected on the day you exchange your vows.
