

February 17, 2019 SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FROM OUR PASTOR:

We have gotten a little snow. You may have noticed or have had to shovel it. Perhaps that brought up stories from grandpa and grandma about when they were kids and it snowed past the roof and they still had to go to school. Or as kids we loved the snow, sliding down hills and making forts. Coming in to get warm by sitting on the floor vents or having hot chocolate.

Archbishop Charles Chaput offers some thoughts on memories. I share this with you from Columbia magazine from the Knights of Columbus.

"Memory is a cornerstone of our identity. It's the storehouse of everything we've learned, all of our love, all of our experiences, and all of their meaning. Memory gives the storyline to our lives. It shapes how we understand the world and approach the future.....Just as memory anchors each person's individual story, history plays the same role for cultures, nations and communities of faith. History is our shared memory. When we Christians lose a strong grasp of our own history--our own unique story and identity--others will gladly offer us a revised version of all three: a version that suits their own goals and bigotries, and not necessarily the truth. And then some very ugly things can happen. A community dies when its memory fails. So our memory as a Christian people *matters*.

A strong statement and yet.....? Do we know our Christian story? The big picture and the story closer to home and our own family's practice of the faith? Genealogy is a popular activity. Yet what of our family, the family of God that we entered on the day of our baptism?

Do we know the Scriptures well? The Old and New Testaments? What of the lives of the saints? They are not just heroes of the faith, but they are our family in the faith. We may know our family's history, stories told when we gather. Still when we gather as a family of faith at Mass and hear our story through the scriptures, do we connect that to us? What do those stories mean to us? A long time ago? Some people that God chose but that does not happen any more.

Every day, just by living we make memories. They don't have to be earth shattering or tragic, still what do people, family and friends, remember about us or take from us? Each of us has the ability to create memories. What will we put our efforts into, what do we chose to do, that will stay in the hearts and minds of those around us?
