

February 21, 2021 FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

FROM OUR PASTOR

Lent. What does that word mean to you?

For some it means fish on Fridays. Others it is giving up chocolate. Ash Wednesday is the start of the season and many see it as a day to show their faith by the wearing of ashes on their foreheads, although not this year.

Last week the insert to the bulletin gave us all a number of resources to go deeper in the faith. Some were on the diocesan website or FORMED. The other side listed some of the Lenten activities going on here at the parish.

Lent often means a greater focus on and in prayer. The Stations of the Cross are highly encouraged. We are using the stations that incorporate the chaplet of Divine Mercy again this year. As a devotion there are many varieties of station booklets whether written centuries ago or just published for this Lent for you to enter more deeply the Way of the Cross, the way of the love of God for each of us.

Lent is seen as a time to prepare for Easter. To be able to truly and fully celebrate the resurrection of Jesus from the dead. That this season does the heavy lifting, the getting in shape, so to joyfully announce the opening of the gates of heaven and the gift of everlasting life.

Confession is often associated with the season of Lent. Every Saturday afternoon before Mass we have a chance to receive the Lord's mercy. On First Saturday, after Mass in the morning, we have that time also to grow in grace. Mark your calendar for March 25th for our communal penance service at 7 pm.

In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus gives us the three main tools of the season. They are prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Again to look at them more fully. Prayer: as simple as lifting up our hearts to God. How hard can that be? How can we not have time to pray daily? But.... Fasting: smaller meals when it comes to food yet we can fast from other things or activities giving that time to God or service of neighbor. Almsgiving: reduced to money in the minds of many, none-theless if practiced well, opens our hearts to those in need.

For some it means purple is the color that they see at church. Or if they are listening, they do not hear the Gloria or Alleluia sung at Mass. Perhaps they would note no flowers around the altar.

As we begin the season, we have 40 days to answer that question. 40 days to live the answer out in a way that brings our words, actions and hearts closer to Jesus.
