FROM OUR PASTOR:

Chivalry, not a word so used or expected in our day. Perhaps it calls to mind knights of old and great quests. So let me offer you part of an article by Samuel Brebner in Shalom Tidings:

"Chivalry was fundamentally about men using their strength to serve and protect others. Ultimately, chivalry is not about performing certain courteous acts; it is about a mindset of respect. A man should not perform chivalrous acts for women because he thinks 'they can't do it themselves'. He should perform such acts out of love and service.

This point is particularly important as we seek to address our culture's huge problem with the objectification of women. Chivalry places a very special emphasis on the way men treat their female counterparts. The chivalrous man is called to uphold the value of women as human persons, not as objects for his pleasure.

To all of my female readers, I think that one of the saddest aspects of the disrespectful behavior some men exhibit toward the opposite sex is that far too many woman tolerate it. In a society where this tolerance exists, alongside a widespread male perception that chivalrous acts are offensive, it is not surprising that the way men relate to women has degenerated.

However, a woman who sets her standards high will be far more likely to attract men who are willing to meet them. You deserve chivalrous men in your life, men who will respect you and authentically care for you."

I hope you have noticed the Safe Haven Sunday bullet points that have been in the bulletin the last number of weeks. I encourage you to look things up on the diocesan website (<u>diolc.org/shs</u>) about it. Pornography is another word that we don't talk about often in a public setting. We can have many thoughts about it or figure it is just a private issue and does not impact others. Yet with technology, it is all over the place and so easy to acquire. It impacts many in ways we can not imagine. Pornography weaves a web that catches many.

Lent is often a time of spiritual intensity for many. They pick up spiritual tools that they lay down the rest of the year. But the fight for holiness is a year around battle. Virtue, holiness and God's grace should be daily things that we strive for in our lives. What do you plan on doing for Lent that will bring you closer to Jesus' plan for you as His disciple? The old saying is -- if you fail to plan, you will plan to fail. What will lead you to a successful Lent?

What other words, activities, or mindset do we need to look at that needs the transforming power of the Gospel to enter in and bring the newness of life and freedom of the Good News, so that we truly live as God's children?

LENTEN REGULATIONS

The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 6th.

Lenten regulations are as follows:

1. Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday.

2. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may eat only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.
