

March 1, 2020 FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

FROM OUR PASTOR

Happy Lent to one and all !!

What does that mean? What is Lent? At our last Holy Happy Hour we discussed Mardi Gras. For many that term is purely secular and only has the sense of party. Mardi Gras or Carnival/Carnevale goes back many centuries. But how it is observed has changed. For some it is a time to enjoy pancakes or Paczki (which are two different things). Going back, the idea was to eat up all that you were not able to eat during Lent; like the lard, sweet fruits, eggs or sugar for example. It was to be a day of frivolity before the "serious" season of Lent. Traditionally there would be processions between station churches. This became the Mardi Gras parades we often see on television. So there is a lot that began as religious observances that were transformed into secular celebrations. "Fat Tuesday" has taken on a whole other sense and become almost a holiday unto itself.

So what is Lent? How do we observe it? What does your family do? Are there special foods that mark the season for you? From the Scriptures we hear the call to fast. Canon Law has those 18 to 59 to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. All are to abstain from meat on the Fridays of Lent who are 14 or older. We could also fast in other ways during Lent like lessening the time spent on social media. This is not to be a short term diet time. Fasting is a way for us to make room for Jesus. It is an exercise of our will. Most people we know will not starve if they truly fasted in this season.

The pretzel, tomato soup or grilled cheese sandwiches let alone Friday fish fries are often staples on the Fridays of Lent. Why those foods? What does that mean? Fridays are days that we are to abstain from meat. Culturally or commercially those foods have become standard for us. Different parts of the world would choose other options, but meat is not one of them on Fridays. How does that fit? On Good Friday Jesus gave Himself up for us, a true sacrifice. We are to offer something up also in uniting ourselves to Jesus' sacrifice. Why by food? There have been other practices that have been penitential and even in some areas of the world there are reenactments that crucify men in imitation of Jesus; although not to death. Jesus died once for us and accomplished our salvation.

Lent is the season that we prepare for the great Paschal feast of Easter. Such a great feast needs time to prepare for. Lent does that. We are to take that time to enter more deeply into prayer. Prayer that moves our hearts ever closer to the heart of Jesus so that we can love our neighbor as He did. Almsgiving also is meant to open our hearts to the needs of our brothers and sisters who are suffering in different ways. Giving of our self is a powerful way to reach out to others but also a way of stretching our own hearts.

As we can see there is a lot to Lent both historically and personally if we allow it. I touched on a variety of things above. Look more closely at this great season and see what depths of perhaps the little things we take for granted that can be tools for us to deepen our relationship with the Lord and new ways to serve and respond to those in need around us, especially spiritually.

Happy Lent to all. (So to have a very joyful Easter.)
