FIRST SUNDAY IN LENT

FROM OUR PASTOR

I take this opportunity to look back at things and see things that we need to pray for as a parish and a people of faith. With gratitude I recall the vocations dinner that was held at St. Patrick and Bishop Callahan and Fr. Kuhn was able to spend some time with 10 young men over a meal with a focus on the priesthood. What a nice relaxed evening. But it does remind us that it has been decades since a priest has come from either of our parishes. Please include prayers for vocations highlighting the priesthood. Yet let us not forget the consecrated life and that marriage is a vocation that needs prayers also.

We have begun the season of Lent this past Wednesday. Ash Wednesday was a day of prayer and fasting. The use of ashes reminds us that we are dust and to dust we shall return. Nonetheless our heavenly Father loves us infinitely. The cross was worth it to Jesus for each and every one of us. Prayer is a key focus in this season of conversion. How are we praying that is changing our hearts? For some, Lent is out there and things to do that seem burdensome. The season of Lent is meant to begin with the heart. Prayer from the heart that will change our heart. What have you chosen to do? Is it transformational? Does it really challenge you to become the child of God our heavenly Father longs for us to be?

As a Deanery we met as priests. It is good for us to get together. Like so many we all can get so busy we don't take the time for one another. Our quarterly meetings help us plan things like our communal penance services which some parishes hold while others set up extra times for people to experience God's mercy. We can underestimate community and how we are connected. But by baptism we are all brought into the Body of Christ. We are not alone. Still many experience life in that way feeling the weight of the world is upon them or what will their family do if they don't take care of everything? Yet Jesus in saving us did not do it alone. In carrying His cross St. Simon of Cyrene assisted Him. We need that reminder. Who is it that you can turn to in your time of need or when you simply need to speak with someone?

March 5th was the Deanery Marriage Preparation event. I am thankful for our team at St. Patrick. They gave up their whole Saturday to be with our young couples preparing for the sacrament of marriage. That too as a vocation is in need of prayers. We know couples who are struggling for many different reasons. We may not hold the answers to what they face, but are we willing to listen? To accompany them? Silently walk with them on this difficult journey they find themselves in at this time?

Pope Francis has called for prayer for Ukraine. War can seem so far from us but the media brings home so many images of suffering. Many groups have stepped up to send assistance or getting ready to provide what is needed when it is possible to get needed resources to them. A great example of this is the Knights of Columbus. There are over 1,500 brother Knights in Ukraine. Such connections make these situations come home all the more. We can all pray for peace that will allow for true security for the people of that nation and the ability for those who fled for their lives to return and rebuild.

May your Lent be filled with gratitude for blessings received and prayers for those in need and the conversion we all need to make the love of God seen and experienced by those around us.
