FROM OUR PASTOR:

Happy St. Patrick's Day to all! What a great day to reflect on our patron parish saint. To consider his life, how difficult and yet with trust in God he was able to accomplish amazing things for the kingdom. What can we do on this feast to proclaim that same Good News in our time?

Last Sunday we talked about Safe Haven Sunday. We have some great tools for families. The book called "Equipped" is available to families. I noticed we have some left in the back of church. That is a great tool to keep your home safe and give parents tools to talk with their children and learn for themselves how technology, which in itself is good, can be abused and expose our children to material they are not ready for or can handle or even need to handle.

There are many other things out there on the internet that are harmful to our young people and are not in the realm of pornography. How aware of them are we as things are changing all of the time? A Lenten reflection from Regina Lawlor Andrews:

With my eyes stinging, I prayed for forgiveness, deeply sorry for being so judgmental. Then, since I had never heard anything more beautiful than the music of their prayer, I joined them in giving all glory to Jesus. Oh, our Father does know what we need and he knows how and when to get us out of our comfort zone. We only need to hear his music!"

What does our Lent look like for us? Is it moving us out of our comfort zone? Is it moving us closer to Jesus and what He wants of us? What can we do to step up and build His kingdom, whether at church or in the world? Let us stop and listen to the music. St. Patrick, pray for us.
