

March 17, 2024 FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus, Praise be to the Lord. As we are getting closer to Easter, some more thoughts on Lent. In a letter to the Agape Community from jail, Philip Berrigan (an American peace activist and a Catholic priest: 1923-2002) wrote, "Expose nonviolently the respectable murderers." Then he acknowledged the need for "someone, whether God or God's prophet," to tear the veil from what he called "a thunderous national silence" around "the BOMB and war-making." Phil saw the bomb as "the taproot of violence, which kills us in every conceivable way," and he offered his "remedy" to "this curse of killing." Phil's solution: "An unequivocal stand against killing in war, killing on death row, killing in the womb, killing the elderly, killing in the home or on the street, killing by economics or dictatorship."

In his cherished, distinctive handwriting in letters written over two decades, Phil succinctly and bluntly calls us to nonviolent faith and action. "I'm writing to Christians — say your prayers, do your homework and take every opportunity to expose nonviolently the respectable murderers. John says it all — lying always accompanies murder. And both are Satanism."

It is time again for deep reflection and prayer as we prepare ourselves for the agony of Good Friday and the joy of Easter. Our prayers continue for a conversion of hearts and minds to nonviolence. We pray for all who live in war: for all those in Gaza, the West Bank, Israel, and across the Middle East; for everyone affected by the war in Ukraine; for the people of Yemen, who have been bombarded for years; for the people of the Great Lakes region of Africa; for those around the world who endure constant threat from state or paramilitary actors. We lament the continued loss of life and health caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, from the continued threats of white nationalism and racial injustice to the intractable issues of poverty and unequal access to healthcare. The season of Lent allows us to root ourselves ever more deeply in discipleship to the nonviolent Jesus, to demonstrate the unbreakable bond that exists between an authentic spirituality and our commitment to social justice, between the proclamation of the gospel and the call to practice peacemaking, fortifying us to address injustice, violence, and oppression.
