THIRD SUNDAY IN LENT

FROM OUR PASTOR

We are about halfway through Lent. How is it going? Has your heart come closer to the heart of Jesus? There are many things in the season that can help us to grow in the faith, service and love of neighbor.

One of the things that is more unique to the season of Lent is praying the Stations of the Cross. At. St. Mary's parish we are offering them each Friday morning following Mass. What a great way to start your day. At St. Patrick's parish we are offering them at 6 pm on Fridays. They are followed by a light soup supper. A discussion on St. Francis de Sales book "Introduction to a Devout Life" is open to everyone even if you couldn't make the stations.

Thinking of our neighbor to the north, St. Paul parish in New Lisbon; they are offering their Lenten Fish Fry on Fridays March 18th and 25th along with April 1st and 8th. They do such a good job, please support them if you can.

On March 19th we had the solemnity of St. Joseph. A solemnity is the highest ranked feast we have in the Church, a reminder and encouragement to truly celebrate such a feast and saint. Last year we celebrated the Year of St. Joseph. He really does give us a great deal to think about even though he did not say a word that is recorded in the scriptures. Pope Francis wrote "Patris Corde" on St. Joseph to help us reflect more deeply on his presence in the Holy Family and in the Church. In this way we may see his importance for our own time and how to follow the example of action he left us.

An action that many take during the season of Lent is going to confession. For many that is such a hard thing to do. We may have many excuses for not going to confession. Our feelings may be mixed or we could be filled with shame for what we have done. The bottom line is God is merciful and wants to forgive us. We only need to give Him that opportunity. The Communal Penance Service at St. Patrick's parish is on April 7th at 7 pm. There will be time for reflection, readings, and other priests from the area to assist you in receiving God's abundant mercy.

At St. Mary's parish we will have extra time for God's mercy on April 3rd. After the 9 am Mass confessions will be heard for an hour and after the 1pm Mass until 2:30 pm.

Don't forget the Mission held at St. Patrick's on March 28-30. There are flyers with more information posted along with information on Facebook. If you can make it all three days that would be a great way to really get into Lent and the healing that our prayer can offer us.

Healing is so needed in our world at this time. Ukraine and Russia need our prayers and sacrifices to convert hearts from war, hatred and division. Yet there are many other places in the world that face conflict too. Suffering is very much a part of our fallen world's experience. We need to do our part, as small as it may seem, but be open to God's grace at all times. Trials can also be right in our homes, lifting those difficulties up to our heavenly Father also for the strength needed to bear with issues that can overwhelm us. We are reminded that with God all things are possible. As we gather for Mass let us hear and live the words "my peace I give you."



Each year revelers hold parties and parades to celebrate his day, yet the average person likely has no idea who Patrick of Ireland truly was. But after returning home, Patrick shocked his contemporaries by voluntarily returning to the place of his enslavement in order to bring the gospel message to the Irish people.
