FROM OUR PASTOR

Perhaps you have seen in some format or other the meme about the scriptures saving "Be not afraid" 365 times. That God is telling you that each day (yes leap day is covered too!). In these most uncertain of days we need to hear that. To hear it and that God is speaking to us each day.

Fear is not meant to rule our hearts and minds. Considering what we are asked to do for the good of others and our own health; dwelling on the negative aspects of what can't be done opens the door to fear and acting out of fear.

Instead let us use prudence. Prudence is a cardinal virtue. From the Catholic Encyclopedia we learn the following. "In the natural order prudence is a virtue acquired and practiced through trial and experience. In the supernatural order prudence is infused at baptism and exercised through sanctifying grace. St. Augustine said of prudence: "Love wisely discerns the means leading to the beloved amid obstacles which would bar the way." It can thus be interpreted in the natural order of man's love for others and in his pursuit of the means that will better enable him to fulfill his end in life, such as education, marriage, vocation, or family obligations."

When we think of the virtues the greatest is Charity. Unfortunately that word has been reduced to simply giving money. Of course that is not a bad thing. People in need require assistance. Not-for-profits also need support. To carry on the Gospel and the work of the Church, there is a need for financial support especially in times like these.

Nonetheless, Charity as a virtue brings in the love of God and neighbor. That love of the other is the motivating factor for our actions. So supporting your local charities and church can be done for a variety of reasons. But to do that with and out of love is what the virtue of Charity is moving us to as we reach out to others.

As perhaps you are spending more time at home or with family, there are a ton of things that you are doing probably out of routine. Lent and every day really is a great day to add the virtue of Charity to all that you are doing. Mother Teresa said "to do little things with great love." That is a challenge for all of us. So as you go about your day, sprinkle love on each of your words, actions and thoughts of others. In this way you can grow in the virtues, grow in your trust in the Lord and in this way 'Be not afraid' everyday!!
