FROM OUR PASTOR:

Palm Sunday ushers us into Holy Week. The readings are powerful. They call us to reflect on what our God has done for us. Yes on one hand we know this. But it is not meant to be something we read or remember year to year only. We are to enter these mysteries (that which we can not fully grasp but can grow into) with an open heart that will allow us to love God all the more and serve our neighbor as we can.

The Chrism Mass is on Tuesday. What a powerful celebration by the Bishop. The oils we use all year long are blessed and are a sign of unity, sharing in these sacraments that Jesus gave to us. Holy Thursday recalls for us the gift of the Holy Eucharist, the gift of Jesus Himself, that we receive; how to thank Him for that? Good Friday is good for us. It is the day that the greatest good is done: salvation for all of creation. Holy Saturday is a time of vigil and prayer. The Easter vigil is the greatest of feasts. Some see it as too long, yet any football or baseball game, any tournament is far longer and no one complains or doesn't bother to come because of it. If it is that difficult for us to spend time with God now, why go to heaven and spend eternity with Him? That may sound tough, but it should open our eyes to look at our priorities.

Easter Sunday!! The resurrection of our Lord. How can we not cry out with joy! How to celebrate and recognize the opening of eternity for us. To be able to look upon the face of God and live? This great feast day continues for eight days, an octave. Divine Mercy Sunday concludes this great feast. For our 150th birthday as a diocese, we as the Tomah deanery are having Bishop Callahan celebrating that feast at Queen of the Apostles parish in Tomah. There will not be any Divine Mercy activities here at St. Patrick's parish. Please join with other parishioners and members of the deanery at Queen of the Apostles.

On Ash Wednesday Jesus told us "When you fast, when you pray, when you give alms." May we use these tools in this last week of Lent to prepare our hearts to know and experience the joyful gifts that our heavenly Father offers to us through Jesus in the life of the Holy Spirit.
