

# March 28, 2021 PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD

#### FROM OUR PASTOR

From Chris Carsten's book "Principles of Sacred Liturgy: Forming a Sacramental Vision."

"But how the faithful can best engage these sacramental signs in a fruitful way is another matter. As we have seen, sacraments, sacramentals, and sacramental things require participants to cooperate with them: liturgy is not magic; sacred signs and symbols are not possessive spells that the priest casts over participants, blanketing them with saving grace against their will. Engaging ritual symbols fruitfully requires docility, purity of heart, attentiveness--and human free will. It also requires the intelligent perception of 'sacramental senses'--the eyes and ears which are properly formed by mystagogical catechesis." (p. 156)

What a powerful reminder as we enter Holy Week. There are so many signs and symbols. How do they speak to us? What is their meaning? What do we do with them?

We gather today on Palm Sunday. The sacramental of the day is of course palms. Why? We turn to Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. So for us, the use of palms is rooted in the scriptures. What use are they for us today? What did they mean when Jesus entered Jerusalem? Such questions remind us of the richness of our faith and how we express it.

In the ancient world, palms were a way of welcome and sign of respect for a king or victor. They were a sign of triumph and peace. They would be placed along the way that the victor would take, as part of their great entry or "victory lap".

It is not a military or political victory that we celebrate on Palm Sunday. The kind of Messiah that Jesus is, is not what was expected or hoped for as He entered the city. We know how it ends. The Cross is not the glory people expected. Even today taking up our cross is not always the first thing we want to do.

So what triumph do we celebrate? What victory are we marking? Perhaps we have lost a sense of what the palm stands for or simply turned it into a decoration that we have in our homes. Have we conquered sinful habits? Have we won the battle against vices or temptation?

Palm Sunday leads us into Holy Week. It is filled with so many signs and sacramentals. Just the vestment colors themselves are pointing us beyond what we see. We go from purple to white to red and white again. For us to fully grasp what lies before us we need to see with sacramental senses that have been formed. What catechesis have we done to freely enter more deeply these symbols that the Church is using this Holy Week?

Not just the eyes, but the ears too. We use the bells at Mass. They bring our attention to the presence of the Lord. Yet entering the Triduum, on Holy Thursday they fall silent. The bells are not used again until the Easter vigil. How does that sign help us? What does it say to our hearts? The other senses too are engaged by other sacramentals.

Good Friday and the Easter Vigil offer us so much to contemplate. For a fruitful engagement and reception of grace, I encourage you to have open hearts when you experience them.

Mauston Community Sharing Pantry News: The 2020 year end stats are in. What a strange year, but the pantry made it through with everyone's help! 600 different families were served. Up to 14 days of food each month were provided. A total 291,427# of food were distributed. Also distributed were 880 senior boxes with 26.400# of additional food.

The generous assistance that the pantry received during the public health emergency allowed the pantry to purchase a new, muchneeded refrigerator, a new carport for safer distribution of food, a new trailer to pick up more food and new shelving to store more food purchased. The pantry is now undertaking an exciting new Pantry Project! Now is the time to redo the parking lot to make it safer for unloading food, more parking for those in need, easier for garbage pick- up and safer for those driving up to pick up food. One project and 4 much needed fixes – what a goal! Matching funds will be provided for anyone who wishes to donate to this "Park it at the Pantry" project. You can just write "Park-it" on your check and your donation will be matched.
