

April 12, 2020 EASTER SUNDAY THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD

FROM OUR PASTOR

Happy and Blessed Easter!! What a blessing it has been. It is true. He is risen, Alleluia, Alleluia.

From the prayer that began the Liturgy of the Word at the Easter Vigil Mass: "Dear brothers and sisters, now that we have begun our solemn Vigil, let us listen with quiet hearts to the Word of God.
