

April 16, 2023 SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER (DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY)

FROM OUR PASTOR

Blessed Divine Mercy Sunday! Through the diary of St. Faustina Jesus revealed His great desire for His people to know and experience His Divine Mercy. His image of Divine mercy, which we have in the gathering area during the year, is to remind us of the outpouring of His mercy. The red and white/pale blue rays coming from His heart show us two of the ways we receive His mercy, grace and support. The white or blue ray is baptism and the red is the Eucharist. St. Faustina wrote "during prayer I heard these words within me: The two rays denote Blood and Water. The pale ray stands for the Water which makes souls righteous. The red ray stands for the Blood which is the life of souls.....These two rays issued forth from the very depths of My tender mercy when My agonized Heart was opened by a lance on the Cross." St. Faustina's diary #299

We are given each year an octave to consider all that was accomplished on the Cross and through the grave as Jesus defeated sin and death. We know that is true. Nonetheless we need to consider how we live that truth out in our daily lives. The image, the chaplet, and the novena are all ways to do that. Recalling Jesus's great act of love at 3 pm each day is a wonderful habit and devotion to develop in your life.

For the celebration of Divine Mercy Sunday we will begin adoration right after the 10 am Mass. At 11:45 the chaplet will be sung and benediction will be at noon, concluding the Divine Mercy activities here at the parish. During the time of adoration confessions will be heard. If you can't make confession for the indulgence, please know you have 8 days after Divine Mercy Sunday.

Please keep in your prayers our second graders who will have a retreat/practice this weekend. They will receive their First Communion on April 23rd at 1 pm. We have a good group and a good sized group of students who have been preparing all year for this moment. Pray for their families too as they encourage them and give them their own witness of their love of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist.

Becoming very real is our move to the gym for Mass. Church Interiors, the company that will be doing the painting, will be arriving on May 1st. So prior to that we will need to move the pews and other larger items from the church. Saturday April 29th will be a moving day. If you are free and ready and able to do some heavy lifting or be an extra set of hands, please reach out to the rectory and let us know.

Like any new activity, this time of transition will have some growing pains. Details even now are being worked out but there are always areas or events that may not have been thought of; your help, understanding and input will be greatly appreciated

The end product, a freshly repainted church and new carpet, will add to that sense of beauty that leads the heart and mind to praise God for all of His blessings in our lives. Keep this large project in your prayers that all goes well and safely for all involved in this work. Thank you ahead of time for all those who have been working in the background to make this happen.

Eucharistic Revival: A Minute with Jesus for April 16th The Eucharist is the Great Miracle of Mercy

In His great love for us, Jesus gave us a great miracle of mercy: The Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist. God did not only become man in the Incarnation to give His life for us on the cross and to rise again in glory for our salvation.
