FROM OUR PASTOR

Easter Sunday, Divine Mercy Sunday and now the Easter season. Wonderful reasons to celebrate and give thanks to God for so many graces. In the Easter season we will be hearing from the Acts of the Apostles. That is our story. It is not just the history of the early church but the story of our family of faith that we are baptized into; a faith that we too are called to joyfully live out and invite others to enter into with us as the family of God.

If you can believe it, we will be having Mass in the Gym starting April 29 & 30! The Mass times remain the same, it is the location that is changing. Confessions also in the gym at 4 pm.

We will be moving things during the week and can really use the help on Saturday April 29th to move the pews and perhaps some other larger things in church to another location. That He is keeping His promise to His people by being with us always. Life can be filled with many trials or we may be facing a number of crosses but we do not do that alone. Taking time to spend with Jesus is a wonderful way to spend the Easter season making the resurrection all the more real in our life of prayer.

Eucharistic Revival: A Minute with Jesus for April 23rd The Eucharist is the Risen Christ

On Easter Sunday, two disciples were leaving Jerusalem without hope as they believed that the Savior was dead. Jesus joined then as they walked but the disciples did not recognize Him as He now had a glorified body. When Jesus sat down with the disciples at Emmaus, they recognized Him in the "breaking of bread," which was the Eucharist. Let's pray this right now and every day this week: "Lord, make my heart burn with a desire to read Your Word in Sacred Scripture". This week, read how Jesus explained how He fulfilled the Old Testament in His Passion, Death and Resurrection, and allowed the disciples to recognize Him in the breaking of the bread in Luke 24:13-35.
