FROM OUR PASTOR:

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus, Praise be to the Lord. The month of May is approaching. The month of May is a special time for Catholics to pay homage to our Blessed Mother Mary. We pay homage to her. Contrary to misconceptions, we do not worship her. As Catholics, we honor Mary. May is the Month of Mary. For centuries, the Catholic Church has set aside the entire month of May to honor Mary, Mother of God. Not just a day in May, but the entire month.

In medieval times, similar customs abounded, all centering around the practice of expelling winter, as May 1st was considered the start of new growth. During the medieval times, the tradition of Tricesimum, or "Thirty-Day Devotion to Mary," came into being. Also called, "Lady Month," the event was held from August 15-September 14 and is still observed in some areas.

The idea of a month specifically dedicated to Mary can be traced back to baroque times. Although it wasn't always held during May, Mary Month included thirty daily spiritual exercises honoring Mary. It was in this era that Mary's Month and May were combined, making May the Month of Mary with special devotions organized on each day throughout the month. This custom became especially widespread during the nineteenth century and remains in practice until today. In India, honoring our Blessed Mother Mary is being done every day in the month of May. Each day, a group of people in the parish come to the church, pray the rosary and offer the Holy Mass in a special way. On the last day of the month, the car procession of the statue of Mary used to be taken around the church.

Coming Wednesday on the first of May, our school children together with the first Holy Communicants are going to do the May Crowning. I cordially invite all the parishioners to participate in this Mass and honor our Blessed Mother.

What is a Plenary Indulgence and what does it do?

Plenary Indulgence refers to sins which have already been repented for and confessed in the Sacrament of Reconciliation and absolved. Even when we have carried out the penance imposed by the Priest, there may still remain some of the "temporal punishment due to sin". Absolution removes the auilt of sin which would condemn us before the heavenly tribunal. However even when absolved we may still need to make a reparation for sins committed, for the damage they caused to others, to the Church or to ourselves. In order to receive the Plenary Indulgence, you must go to confession and receive absolution and complete your penance within the week before the activity and remain free from all sin. You must receive communion the day of the activity. You must offer intentions for the Holy Father by reciting the Our Father and the Hail Mary. By receiving a Plenary Indulgence you will be free from any temporal punishments (Purgatory) for all confessed sins.
