

# May 7, 2023 FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

## FROM OUR PASTOR

Well we made it through the first weekend in the gym! Again I would like to thank so many who did a great job behind the scenes getting everything ready. Last Saturday went so very smoothly with so many volunteers making light work of some very heavy items. I am grateful for those who have reached out to the rectory with ideas. Just a point of clarification, over retreat I was able to talk with our Diocesan Master of Ceremonies about Mass in the gym, metal folding chairs and kneeling. His direction is to stand when we would normally be kneeling. Of course he did mention that for some, because of age or health, they should feel comfortable sitting if they need to. Also if someone wishes to kneel, they are free to do so. So for the majority of people the posture at Mass will be standing after the Holy, Holy and Lamb of God. When you return to your seat after receiving Holy Communion please be seated and offer thanks or join in singing the hymn.

As announced last weekend, May 9th at 10 and 11 am will be the filming of the TV Mass. If you can be part of the congregation for either or both Masses to be filmed that day it would be greatly appreciated. Please arrive at St. Joseph Parish in Adams at least 15 minutes before the hour so as to receive needed directions. It has been a long time since I have done one of the TV Masses and is a great outreach to so many of the homebound. I encourage you to be a part of it if your schedule allows.

#### Eucharistic Revival: A Minute with Jesus for May 7th

**Confession – A preparation for receiving the Eucharist** The best way to prepare to receive Jesus in the Holy Eucharist is by going to Confession (also known as the Sacrament of Reconciliation, Penance). We want to receive Him with a clean heart. If it is not possible to go to Confession before receiving Jesus, make a sincere Act of Contrition in your heart, and as always pray with sincerity the prayer at Mass, "I confess to Almighty God..." A sin that is mortal – serious or grave – requires Sacramental Confession before receiving Holy Communion. If you are not sure about this, speak with a priest. Let's pray this right now and every day this week: "Jesus, please give me the grace to be truly sorry for my sins". This week read how God calls us out of darkness into His own wonderful light in 1 Peter 2:9-10
