Mary, a Model for Motherhood

The fourth week of Easter is an invitation for the World Day of Prayer for Vocation. As we pray for all those who have responded to God's call, let us also pray for our youth that they may respond to God's call. Another event that falls on May 08th is Mother's Day. Our prayerful wishes to all our mothers. As we are in the month of May, dedicated to Mary, the Church calls us to open our hearts in a special way to Mary. Hence let us learn some lessons from motherhood of Mary.

Mother's Day has a deep spiritual dimension. Mary, the mother of Jesus, is the greatest of all mothers. Motherhood has always been a sacred and noble vocation, but Mary raised it to even greater stature when she became the Mother of God. As the mother who is "blessed among women" (Lk 1:42), Mary gives us the clearest and most inspiring picture of what the ideal mother should look like.

Pope Benedict XVI said that "Mary is the image and model of all mothers, of their great mission to be guardians of life, of their mission to be teachers of the art of living and of the art of loving."

Mary, a Prayerful Mother: Mary accompanied Jesus's entire life in prayer, right up to His death and resurrection; and in the end, she continued and she accompanied the first steps of the early Church. Mary prayed with the disciples who had witnessed the scandal of the cross. Mary was there, with the disciples, in the midst of the men and women whom her Son had called to form His Community. She prayed with them and prayed for them. Mary's prayer is silent. Mothers who follow Mary's example are invited to be deeply prayerful, and speak to God from their hearts day-by-day (Magnificat).

Mary, Our spiritual Mother: Mary's presence in our lives is a motherly presence. We call her Our Blessed Mother. Indeed, from the Cross, Jesus gave her to us as our Mother and entrusted us to her as her children. Jesus' words to John, the beloved disciple, were also addressed to all of us: Behold your mother! From the cross, Jesus gave us the beautiful gift of his mother to be our mother too. As per Bishop Kevin, "Jesus made his mother the mother of all the members of his Mystical Body, the Church. Jesus invites us to accept Mary as our mother and to respond to her motherly love as true children."

Mary, a Consoling Mother: Mary the mother of Jesus stood near to the cross so that her son could see her and know she was there for him. She suffered with him as though to bear some of his pain. That's what mothers do. Mary never abandoned her son, even during adulthood, particularly when things were at his worst. This sort of enduring love is exemplary for Christian mothers.

Mary, a Model for Christian Mothers: According to Fr. Michael Van Sloun, "every conception is a miracle, and every Christian mother knows that she is a partner with God in the ongoing work of creation, deeply aware that her child is a gift from God." As a result, when a Christian woman is blessed with a pregnancy, she rejoices in her child as Mary rejoiced in Jesus, she completes her pregnancy rather than end it in abortion, and cares for her unborn child with good nutrition, medical checkups, and the avoidance of smoking, alcohol, or any drugs that could have a harmful effect. Christian mothers also do not focus solely on themselves and their own families. Instead, they have the marvelous ability to assist relatives and friends who are in need, like Mary visited Elizabeth.

Our Gratitude and Prayers for our Earthly Mothers: As we honor Mary Mother of God, we also honor our earthly mothers. On Mother's Day, we remember with gratitude and affection our mothers, not only through material gifts, flowers, or cards, but also, and more importantly, by our prayers for them. We thank God for the gift of our mothers who conceived and gave birth to us, who cared for us, protected us, taught us, and loved us. Many passed on the precious gift of faith to us. We remember all our mothers, living and deceased. We thank them for their generosity and self-giving love.

A Catholic Take on Star Wars

Join a Biblical scholar and a moral theologian as they discuss Star Wars!
