How can I learn more about the Campaign? At this stage in the campaign, full campaign brochures have been sent to your home containing a letter from Bishop Callahan and one from Fr. John. The brochure also contains details regarding the case for support, a suggested giving chart and tax advantages of giving. You may also visit www.inspiredbythespirit.org or speak with our Campaign volunteers, Kevin and Julie Whitney.

How can I make my pledge? A volunteer team is currently being assembled and trained. Over the next several weeks, these volunteers will be contacting parishioners to discuss the campaign and the various opportunities available for making sacrificial pledges. We ask that you take the time to speak with our campaign volunteers. After all, they are your fellow parishioners and worship side-by-side with you each week. The best way to make your pledge is with one of our volunteers. Pledge cards are also available at the rectory office.

How much should I pledge? As a guide, each family is invited to consider making a pledge commitment of \$45 a month over the next 60 months. After a 10% down payment, that is a total pledge amount of \$3,000 over the next five years. As you discern what giving level is right for you, keep in mind that this campaign is based on equal sacrifice and not equal giving. We understand that each family has distinct financial obligations and circumstances. Every pledge makes a difference and is truly appreciated!

**Joan of Arc**

Although she died at nineteen in 1431, her legend and legacy is stronger than ever five hundred years later. Leelee Sobieski shines as the legendary warrior and saint, Joan of Arc, who, at seventeen, led one of the greatest military campaigns for freedom the world has ever witnessed. Supported by an all-star cast, with glorious cinematography, music score, and stunning scenery, Joan of Arc is a riveting epic film of faith, inspiration, triumph, and tears. Born to a peasant French family, Joan hears the voices of saints calling out to her to unite her besieged nation.

Gaining an audience with the young French king, Joan convinces him that God is calling her to command an army into battle to save France. It becomes an incredible adventure that leads to thrilling victories and heartbreaking betrayals — as Joan of Arc defies all odds and marches into history.
