THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

FROM OUR PASTOR

With the end of the Easter season we have some great feasts of faith. This Sunday is Trinity Sunday. Each of them gives us the opportunity to reflect on an aspect of faith and the life of God. This feast helps us conclude the major mysteries of faith. We began the liturgical year getting ready for the Incarnation in Bethlehem. From there we follow Jesus' life and work for our salvation. It finally leads us to Jerusalem; His passion, death and resurrection. His work does not stop there. He ascends and soon after sends the Holy Spirit. The feast of Pentecost is what we celebrated last Sunday. So the work of Jesus in the flesh is completed. Now is the work of the Holy Spirit that is meant to bring us into the life of God, the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Coming to know God so that we can live with His grace here on earth and enter eternity is our goal. So coming to know each of the persons of the Trinity is part of deepening the practice of our faith. The Trinity as a teaching of the faith is a mystery in the fullest sense. Something we are meant to be drawn into, that can continuously reveal itself to us. In a sense it is all about relationship. Coming to know and be known by another.

An example of that is my "Priest group." The five of us have been meeting for the last 20 years. We gather together on Sunday evening once a month and catch up and do something social followed by supper. Then we meet on Monday for a holy hour and Mass. After breakfast we take time to speak about what is going on in life and in our ministry. After twenty years we have come to know each other well. Nonetheless at times to bring up some deep personal and spiritual events can be difficult. So where do we do that in a way that builds us up?

We hold each other accountable. We all have areas that are not a strength or we struggle with. Yet knowing we will be talking about it again the next time we meet motivates us to work on it. Or if we are not, the fact is "it" and our group is not going away. That maybe something we need in our lives is someone who will hold us accountable, keeping goals before us. It can be frustrating and require hard work as we look at areas that touch on the core of who we are. But relationships change us. Are we looking at how that happens in our daily lives?

Thinking about the Trinity may be something we don't often do. Perhaps it seems too far away, theoretical or not a part of our daily life. But we all have relationships. Do we look at them? Realize the power that they have to change us? Are we an agent for change in a positive way with those around us? Are there relationships we need to walk away from? What if someone walks away from us, would we know why?

The Catechism of the Catholic Church offers us many points of reflection to come to know the Trinity better. Paragraphs 232-267 give us a good starting point. That is great information and knowledge. But we know that in any relationship it is not information we are seeking. We want to connect and become known and valued. God does that with us. God longs for that to happen. With this great feast let's look at our relationship with God, the Trinity of persons and consider how transformative and life giving that relationship is. God does not walk away from us, so let us in our journey of faith, walk ever closer to Him.
