THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

FROM OUR PASTOR:

I know that school is out for our students here at St. Patrick. What a hot and wet week it was for them. But they can now enjoy their summer break. But we really don't truly stop learning as long as we live, it is just a matter of how or what. So for June I am looking at a "summer school review" through my articles. Let's look at prayer. We all do it, right? Let me share with you the thoughts of Jennifer Hubbard, a mom who lost her daughter Catherine (a first grader) on Dec. 14, 2012 at Sandy Hook elementary school in Newton.

She was asked in an interview "what can you share about prayer, especially during tragic times like you experienced? We need to pray for guidance for what we do with this and who we become because of this. I know the reason that we could get up and do what we did in the days, weeks, and months after Catherine died is because we had prayer armies behind us.

People who didn't know my husband or me or Catherine said, "We're praying for peace and comfort and blessing in your mourning." I know now prayer doesn't have to be some predetermined words that have to be said in a certain way and manner. Prayer for me at that time was sitting down and bowing my head and knowing I didn't have the words. [For] people impacted by loss and grief and trauma to as high a magnitude as we experienced, [I want to remind them that] for prayer they don't have to say a word.

Now, thankfully, I'm one of those people who can offer prayers on their behalf. My prayer is the same as prayers offered for me. There are so many times when I say to someone, "I'm praying for you." As a Catholic community, that needs to be our response. There's nothing that we can do or say to change how this story ends, but we can pray. And there's power in that."

How do we pray? Are we in a routine that does not bring life? The Holy Spirit is meant to lift us up, to lift up our hearts as we say at each Mass (our greatest prayer). How do we approach prayer? Do we rush in and blurt out a few things to a friend and leave? No, we take time to visit with friends. We listen and we talk. Do we have that balance in our life of prayer? Does our prayer challenge us? Does God call us to greater service of our family or neighbors?

If not, are we really listening. We have only to look at the scriptures and all the saints and see where God takes them. Are we ready for such a journey? If not, this summer is a great time to start, to learn how to pray in a manner that moves our hearts and wills ever closer to God's for us and our good and the good of our neighbor.

Jennifer also said "I remember sitting at a stoplight and [being] specifically exhausted in keeping it all together. And I let out a scream that to this day I don't recognize who or where it came from. As soon as I did it, I realized probably for the first time in my life--I was real and authentic with God....There was a peace and stillness I will never be able to convey, but realized I wanted more of that. And that would come through an authenticity with a God who loved me." May we too, be real with God, who really wants us to be with Him. So this summer, let us pray.
