

June 6, 2021 THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST (Corpus Christi)

FROM OUR PASTOR

Welcome back, Deacon! Last summer when he was here, Eric Mashak was a part of the Corpus Christi procession as a seminary student. Now the studies are over and he is in his last few weeks of prayer before ordination to the priesthood for the diocese of La Crosse. Let us keep him and his classmates in our prayers.

The feast of Corpus Christi reminds us of how our Lord keeps His promises. He said He would be with us always. He remains with us in the Holy Eucharist. In a special way He is physically with us by the reservation of the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle.

That was done by the early church so that those arrested and in prison could receive Him and be strengthened for their time of trial. Many who were also arrested were to be martyred, so they too were aided by the reception of Holy Communion before they went before their executioners shedding their blood for their faith in Jesus.

This feast highlights the reverence we are to have for the Blessed Sacrament. Jesus is truly present, so we genuflect before Him. If not physically able to do so, a profound bow is to be offered to God. Perhaps we are a little too fast in our actions and they do not reveal that God is right there before us. Another reminder is to consume Jesus immediately upon reception if we are receiving Holy Communion in our hands. We do not want to drop our Lord because we are inattentive or focused on returning to our pew.

Having time for adoration is part of the feast of Corpus Christi. It highlights the reality of His presence in our midst. These days it is a great reminder that we are not alone. Many have felt isolated physically or emotionally for a number of reasons: adoration is that time with Another who never leaves us or abandons us.

In the scriptures we have the image of Jesus walking with the crowds. They want to be with and close to Jesus. The procession following the 10 am Mass is our chance to bring that image to life for the same reasons. We too want to walk with Jesus. It is a great image of our God going out to people. He did that by coming in the flesh and in the flesh under the appearance of consecrated Bread He goes out into our community.

The crowds often were looking for something. Some people wanted healing. We need that in our own day too. Many I believe need a hidden healing that lies deep in our hearts and minds. We may not see it but we and many are wounded and need to come before Jesus. The crowds often were hungry. Many can look to their full pantry or fridge, that is not the hunger they have. It is a hunger that only Jesus can satisfy if we allow Him to feed us.

I wish to encourage you to be a part of our Corpus Christi celebration even if it is to walk (or drive) over to the park for a few minutes of adoration. Benediction will be at 2 pm.

We are looking for help selling Fall Festival Raffle Tickets at parades this summer. We will post parade information in the bulletin as we receive it. Come out and help! Thanks!


