## FROM OUR PASTOR

A quick thank you to Fr. Bowe for covering the Saturday Masses allowing me to be a part of and having weddings back home with family and friends. I wish to acknowledge also that the sound system in the gym has been a headache for everyone. Each week there has been a tweak to the system that is not really making things any better. Luckily the painters are doing very well and perhaps we can look forward to being back in church a little earlier than planned. But like many things in life, let's see what happens.

Corpus Christi is a wonderful feast and opportunity for us to reflect on the great gift of Jesus Himself to each of us. The reality of this sacrament should cause us to be overwhelmed by God's goodness and humility. We as a parish have the chance to have a procession down to Riverside park and have a time of adoration there. How many places in the world is the public display of the faith forbidden and outright opposed by the civil government. In this time of the Eucharistic Revival, this is a great way to deepen our devotion to Jesus.

From there I continue the day in Black River Falls for the installation of Fr. Arivu Mariappan as the pastor of Guardian Angels parish. That will be one of the last acts I do on behalf of Bishop Callahan as the Dean of the Tomah deanery. Representing the Bishop or confirming in his place by delegation are a few of the things that a dean does. My transfer to another deanery then removes me from that position. So acting with the Bishop as Dean for Juneau, Jackson and Monroe counties has been a privilege and way of coming to know and serve so many.

June 12th is the healing Mass in Cashton. This will be the second one offered and the prayer teams will be local and have been preparing for their roles the last number of months. More details are inside the bulletin. Feel free to make what part of the evening you can.

June 14th is the day that I am going up to Stevens Point and meet with Fr. Arul Joseph and the staff at St. Peter's parish. I will find out what I am getting into!? Of course there is still a lot going on here at St. Patrick. I encourage you to keep June 30th open in the evening for a gathering; a chance to be grateful and for goodbyes.

I will be leading a two day retreat the following week and then off to La Crosse for the annual Priest Unity Days. So two moments of grace that I ask you to keep in your prayers.

The whole month of June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. There are many ways to keep this devotion. The most obvious is the Litany of the Sacred Heart. Feel free to google that or on any catholic prayer app you will find it. So many of the saints have encouraged this devotion as a reminder of the humanity of Jesus. That He is truly God and Man. We are to always keep that balance. It is not easy since some wish Him to be totally like us and excuse our behavior as if we don't need mercy. Or the other way around and see Him as so divine that He can not understand us or even be close to us and not a part of our lives. Yet the heart of God beats for us and God always acts out of love for us. So take some time to return that love through this or other devotions that help you come to know and love Him all the more.

### Eucharistic Revival: June 11th A Minute with Jesus June 11 – Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ: Corpus Christi

The Holy Eucharist is Jesus Christ, really and truly present. The Feast of Corpus Christi celebrates the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. At the consecration of every Mass, the priest prays the words which Jesus Himself pronounced over bread and wine, "This is My Body," "This is My Blood." The bread is no longer bread, and the wine is no longer wine. We receive Jesus Himself as nourishment for our souls. This week read these words of Jesus every day: "Whoever eats My Flesh and drinks My Blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day" (John 6: 54).

# Pick of the Week

#### Slaves and Kings: The Story of St. Anthony Mary Claret

Set in Spain in the 1800s, this dramatic feature film tells the compelling story of St. Anthony Mary Claret, an Archbishop, writer, publisher, social reformer, missionary, and confessor to the Queen of Spain. Claret, one of Spain's most popular preachers, founded the religious congregation of the Missionary Sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, known as the Claretians.

Regarded as the "spiritual father of Cuba" due to his zealous missionary work there, Claret's apostolic work also took him to the Canary Islands, Madrid, Paris, and the First Vatican Council. Before the priesthood, he was a professional weaver in the textile mills of Barcelona. After being ordained, he spent 10 years giving popular missions and retreats, always placing great emphasis on the Eucharist and devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The Rosary was never out of his hand.

Appointed to the greatly neglected archdiocese of Santiago, Cuba, he began its reform by ceaseless missions and hearing confessions and suffered bitter opposition for opposing concubinage and slavery. His solution for the misery of Cubans was family-owned farms producing a variety of foods for the family's own needs and for the market. This invited the great enmity of the vested interests who wanted everyone to work on a single cash crop—sugar. Surviving 14 attempts on his life, he went back to Spain to be the confessor of the Queen and also founded a major Catholic publishing house, printing hundreds of books and pamphlets on Catholicism. Claret died in 1870 and was canonized as a saint in 1950.
