

# June 23, 2019 THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST (CORPUS CHRISTI)

#### FROM OUR PASTOR

I am writing this before I go to La Crosse. First there is Priest Unity Days. We all gather for a few talks, the Jubilee Mass for all the priests marking special anniversaries, and the closing address by Bishop Callahan. Then on Saturday is the ordination of transitional deacons Ethan Hokamp and Brandon Guenther to the priesthood for our diocese.

Then Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday I will be at Notre Dame University, not to spend time with the Fighting Irish, but for a conference on Catholic Schools with priests from all over the country. Bishop has sent two priests for the last few years, so pray for successful meetings and good fruit to bring back to St. Patrick.

June 28th is the feast of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, often a day to pray for priests. I know that I can use them! It is also a day that the rectory staff will be having an in service, so the office will only be open part of the day.

If you are reading this before Mass, consider the intention you will have during our few minutes of adoration at the end of the Mass. Also look at your summer schedule, does it allow you to attend our weekly holy hour on Friday afternoon? Or look ahead and see if our first Friday of July (or any month) will work for you to spend some time adoring our Lord.

As June has so many wedding anniversaries I offer the following from "101 Tips for a Happier Marriage." "Let the difference between you and your spouse become a source of strength. It is a scientifically proven fact that men and women differ in significant ways. Appreciate and use the differences, rather than fight over them. It's okay that he normally takes out the trash and she normally washes the dishes. Don't fret about falling into gender stereotypes. There's a reason why men and women typically do those tasks--because they are men and women. It just comes naturally. Go with it. Men and women complement each other, and together make a great team, especially when it comes to raising children. Play to your strengths."

The next section of tips is titled: Realize that your Marriage Matters. "Picture yourself five years from now. See yourself grateful that you stuck with your spouse. Researchers from the Institute for American Values followed couples in crisis who contemplated divorce. Five years later, most of those who stayed married were glad they did. Remind yourself of this the next time you think you can't take any more. Take a deep breath, pull your shoulders back, and keep moving forward, doing what needs to be done to make things better."

Tips are helpful. But anyone in need, needs prayer and we as a community of faith can pray for others. Sometimes a listening ear is needed to be helpful. I hope we can all be there for others. It maybe the same story but they may need to work through something. But most of us are not professional counselors, so if someone you care about is stuck, encourage them to reach out. We also need at times to not worry about what others think about us or our situation, but reach out to those who can help. Some situations we can not deal with alone. Marriage is a vocation and a sacrament; there is grace because it is not a walk in the park; but a lifelong journey.
