FROM OUR PASTOR:

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus, Praise be to the Lord. Happy to write these few lines for the bulletin before I get back to the parish. I will be back on Tuesday 25th and start saying Masses regularly. My vacation in India was a wonderful one. Looking forward to seeing you all.

This week, I write about St. Osanna of Mantua. From a young age, Osanna's life was marked by deeply religious experiences. At just six years old, she reported seeing angels, and pledged her life to the service of God. When she was fourteen years old, her father had arranged a marriage for her. She knew she was called to devote herself only to God, so she secretly travelled to a Dominican convent and received the religious habit of Dominican nuns. She had become a Third Order Dominican nun—a lay sister.

Osanna's devotion to God meant not just loving him, but loving those around her as well. She put off making her final vows as a nun for 37 years so that she could care for her siblings after her parents passed away. She used her family's wealth to support the poor and sick, served as a spiritual guide to many, and courageously spoke against moral decay in society.

As an outward reflection of her devotion to God, Osanna also experienced miracles on her spiritual journey. Legend has it that she miraculously learned to read and write after seeing the words "Jesus" and "Mary" on a piece of paper. At the age of thirty, she received the stigmata, bearing the wounds of Jesus on her head, side, and feet. The virtue of devotion consists of loyal, loving, consistent, and enthusiastic desire to please God in all things. It is a specifically religious act, chosen deliberately and freely, and directed toward God. Too many people misplace their devotion. Be careful not to misplace yours. To give something that belongs to God to anyone or anything else is a grave disorder.

We are so glad that you have chosen this place of worship to honor the Lord's name with us. If you are new to this church or just visiting, we would like to thank you for worshipping with us and we warmly welcome you to St. Patrick's as our brothers and our sisters. Please come and enjoy the music of our own 'St. Patrick's Spirit and Spark' musicians, as they share contemporary praise and patriotic songs on Monday, July 1st at 6 PM at Riverside Park. We hope to see you there.

On July 1st, Pope Francis will preside over a Consistory of Cardinals, which will deliberate the canonization of Blessed Carlo Acutis, an Italian teenager who died in 2006 at just 15 years of age. He was born in London, but grew up in Milan, where he managed the website for his parish and a Vatican-based academy. He created an online database of Eucharistic miracles worldwide, and was known as "God's Influencer." He was beatified in 2020. Last month the Holy Father Pope Francis attributed a second miracle to him, which involved the healing of a university student who had a brain bleed. It is expected that, on July 1st, the date of his canonization will be announced. Blessed Carlo Acutis died in Monza, Italy, and his body was moved to Assisi where it is on display at the Church of Saint Mary Major.

Change to Stipends effective July 1st, 2024 ~ For 30 years the suggested donations for Masses, funerals, and marriages has remained the same throughout the dioceses of Wisconsin. The Bishops of Wisconsin gathered recently and decreed that stipends should be adjusted to reflect the current time and to account for inflation.

The new suggested stipends are as follows:

Mass Stipends: \$20 / Funerals: \$75
Marriages: \$100 / Quinceaneras: \$100

These new suggested amounts take effect with events that take place on or after July 1, 2024. They do not apply retroactively to those who have already paid the appropriate amount for an upcoming event (even one that takes place after July 1, 2024) The new suggested stipend amounts will be applied to all new requests we receive for events that occur on or after July 1, 2024. *As always, if someone is not able to offer the stipend, the parish is always happy to provide the sacrament or service with no fee.*

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its policies and procedures, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to *Mrs. Teresa Brown, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004*. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Brown at 608.791.0179 or intakeagent@diolc.org. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: diolc.org/safe-environment/reporting. Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities. Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local parish and on the diocesan website.
