

June 26, 2022 THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FROM OUR PASTOR

As we continue our reflection of the gift of the Holy Eucharist in this month of June, I return to the "Eucharistic Jubilee" by the USCCB.

"Where the Blessed Sacrament is present, either in a tabernacle or exposed on the altar for adoration, this is evidence that a community has celebrated the Eucharist, with all that this means and implies. We can never adequately grasp how much is accomplished in the community every time the Eucharist is celebrated. It is this that we are seeking to understand more and contemplate in a continued adoration of Christ in the sacrament. When I am present before Christ in the tabernacle, it is a time of intimate communion with Him simply because I am concentrated on Him. I can deepen in a very personal way the communion with Him that I have experienced in the communal celebration, a communion which, as I suggested in the beginning, is perhaps too difficult to grasp and digest all at once during Mass. The Sacrament exposed on the altar concentrates my attention on the very place where the community has celebrated the memorial of the Lord's death. Generally the exposition of the Blessed Sacrament is done for the sake of a more communal adoration. Even if I am in silent prayer alone, I am alongside others who adore with me. We adore because we have celebrated. Our adoration increases not only communion with Christ but with one another, expressing one same faith together. "

So the Holy Eucharist is meant to bring us together and build that sense of unity, of being one family brought together by and through Jesus Christ. That sense of unity, of being "we" or "us" is lacking in society. All we see is division around us. The need for prayer is obvious. And not just a quick prayer (which is good) but prayer that takes us deeper and allows the Holy Spirit to shape our hearts into one as Jesus prayed for at the Last Supper.

Our prayer is meant to guide us along God's path. The journey we find ourselves on in life is not always easy. We do need others to walk it with us. So that sense of unity is so important.

We are reminded that we are one diocese on June 25th when we gather as a church to celebrate the ordination of two men to the priesthood. Transitional deacons Matthew Bowe and Steven Weller are to be ordained as priests to serve our diocese. Fr. Bowe will be the associate pastor at Queen of the Apostles in Tomah. Fr. Weller will be associate pastor at Our Lady Queen of Heaven in Wisconsin Rapids and chaplain at Assumption middle school and high school. Fr. Bowe will be nearby and hopefully we can have him be a part of events here at St. Mary or St. Patrick. Fr. Weller spent a summer with us at St. Patrick and it was a wonderful thing to be a part of his journey.

As we mentioned, prayer above, especially before the Blessed Sacrament, brings us greater unity and guidance. There may be some young men in our parishes who need your prayer to hear God's call. That they may open their hearts to God's guidance. It takes the whole church to bring forth a priestly vocation. Prayer for families too, since that is where a priestly vocation begins. Yes we all need prayer and should pray for one another nonetheless since priests do not grow on trees or can be picked up on the shelf at Walmart; we all need to be united as a community of faith in our prayers for priestly vocations.

God bless Frs. Bowe and Weller as they begin their priestly service. Pray for them.




