## FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear people of God,

Joyful greetings from Fr Chinnappan from the **Roman Catholic Diocese of Vellore**, **India**. But now I am serving as associate pastor at Mauston here in our diocese of La Crosse for the last three months.

I'm really happy to share some details of my native diocese with you on this weekend. Next weekend (July 10/11, 2021) will be a mission appeal for my diocese. Our diocese was started by Salesians in the year 1952 carving out a portion from the Archdiocese of Madras-Mylapore. Further in 1969, a few parishes from the Archdiocese of Pondicherry-Cuddalore were attached to this Diocese. It is comprised of two civil districts, namely Vellore and Tiruvannamalai. There are 84 parishes having a Catholic population of 150,000. By the way, my beloved bishop, Most. Rev. Dr. Sounder Raju Sdb, passed away on March 20, 2020 during this pandemic time. The present Administrator is **Very. Rev Msgr. John Robert.** The total Number of active priests are **148**.

Can you imagine a land where 1.6% of the population are Christians who put their faith into action through a challenging ministry among 82% Hindus? Can you imagine a land where many of your privileges are denied because you are Christian? But with all this, my Diocese of Vellore does a wonderful ministry of proclaiming the good news and the works of charity such as running a school for the poor, building mission and ministry facilities, leading children's outreach programs, responding to natural disasters, and reaching out to individuals and communities through Christian service. Our diocesan administrator, Very. Msgr. John Robert, struggles to accomplish all these projects successfully. He even struggles to pay medical bills of the pastors affected by Covid-19 and other sickness.

Next weekend, I will be here asking your financial help to build a rectory in a new parish which was erected in the year 2018 an does some relief works for the people affected economically because of Covid-19. Many people are without jobs now. The situation there is no work means no income. There is no facility to work from home. Many people live rural areas. The Covid-19 situation in my state is very bad now. The total cost of the rectory is around 35,000 dollars. I am not asking you to give this entire amount especially in this difficult time that we are all in. Four priests from my diocese are working in our Lacrosse diocese. All four will be going to four different parishes to appeal for support for this project. I request you to donate only what you could do. If you would like to be part of this mission through your financial support, please send a check made out to your parish name "St. Patrick Parish" and mention "Mission Coop" in memo column.

I also request your support, most importantly, by your prayer. Without prayer, nothing will happen especially in this pandemic times.

Thank you very much for your kindness and generosity to my Church in Vellore, India. Your contributions will continue to strengthen our ministerial initiatives and evangelization efforts.
