**FROM OUR PASTOR**

As I look forward to my time in Kansas with classmates, I see that it will be 100 degrees most of the week. Pray I don't melt. Changing things up can be good for us. Although most of the time we don't like change, it can be good for us. Being caught in a rut may not help us. Just like a workout routine, at first it helps give us great results, nonetheless our body adjusts over time. We need to keep it fresh. A routine can be very beneficial and keep us on track. But it is good for us to look at what we regularly do and check to see that it is helping us.

We can get used to working all the time and not realize we don't really leave it at the office or where ever we may work. It is right there with us. The same can be said for prayer and our spiritual life. Priests are required to go on retreat every year. The church sees the value in it. So too does God. We are given Sunday, the Lord's Day to get out of our work routine. We are to set things aside, putting God first. I remember growing up and having "church clothes" that we had to change out of when we got home after Mass. Do we make that effort and make the day special and different? Using even something so simple as "Church clothes" as a reminder we are doing something different when going to Mass?

Here are a few thoughts from Jennifer Roback Morse & Betsy Kerekes (101 tips for a Happier Marriage) that may help you get out of a routine and deepen your marriage.

**Make a decision to love .**

Love is a decision, not just a feeling. Think about what is in your spouse's interest. A loving person wants the best for another and is willing to follow through with actions. You can improve your marriage by making a decision to love. In fact, you can improve the lives of many people by making the decision to do what is in their interest, even if it is inconvenient for you at the time.

Help your spouse grow by being the first to step outside the comfort zone. Fear is never a good excuse to refrain from growing closer to God or each other. Make a leap of courage by pushing yourself emotionally and spiritually, and hope that your spouse will be inspired by your actions. Be patient with yourself and your spouse.

Remain in solidarity with the other person, especially when he or she is suffering or struggling. Love sits by the bedside, even when it is painful to watch. An easy way to show support for your spouse is to be present and available to them when they are going through a challenging time. It might be frustrating to listen to your spouse complain, or it might be sad for you to watch your loved one in pain, but your silent presence will communicate to both of you your commitment to your relationship.

**Franciscan Mission Appeal**

On the weekend of July 14-15, as part of the 2018 Missionary Cooperative Program in the Diocese of La Crosse, there will be a collection at each Mass to support the missions of the Conventual Franciscan Friars. Fr. Stanislaw Rochowiak OFM Conv. will preach at all Masses about the work his Order is doing to spread the Gospel throughout the world.

Fr. Stanislaw Rochowiak has been a missionary in Uzbekistan for about 12 years, having served in various capacities throughout the country. He is currently pastor of Sacred Heart Cathedral in Tashkent. Fr. Stanislaw was ordained in 1995 in Krakow, Poland and soon after that, studied Scripture at the Catholic University in Lublin, Poland. He also served for one year (2001) at the Basilica of St. Stanislaus in Chicopee, MA.

The Conventual Franciscans number over 4,500 friars living in 70 countries spread over 6 continents. While the Conventual Franciscans are blessed to count many saints in their history, they are perhaps best known for being the Order to which St. Maximilian Kolbe belonged.

The proceeds of the collection will support the education of young friars throughout Africa, Asia, Eastern Europe, and Latin America as well as the friars' work among the poor in these regions. 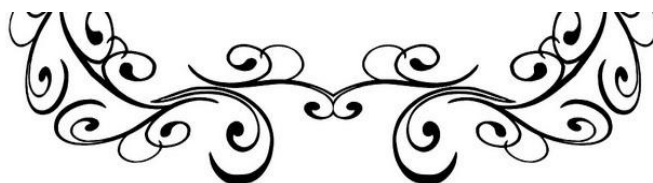

### Did you know?.....

March 3 of this year marked the 150 year anniversary for the Diocese of La Crosse. The diocese celebrates this anniversary with the publication of Feed My Lambs, the story of the diocese and its parishes. I picked out some neat details from the book to interest you and promote this excellent publication. Here are just a few of the details I learned from its many pictures, old documents, and detailed history.

1. Our diocese is the birthplace of Fr. Solanus Casey, who was beatified in 2017.
2. Bishop Treacy, our fifth bishop, participated in the Second Vatican Council.
3. Our current cathedral is the second for the diocese, the first finished in 1870, the second 1962.
4. Karol Wojtyla (Pope St. John Paul II) visited Rosholt, WI in 1976.
5. Prairie du Chien was, for a long time, the prospective place for the diocesan cathedral.
