**FROM OUR PASTOR**

Dear friends in Christ Jesus,

Praise be to the Lord. It is my second week in this parish. Last weekend was a wonderful feel for me. I felt so much welcomed by the parishioners. I was so much encouraged and boosted up while talking to the people who stayed back for doughnuts and coffee after all three Masses. I felt very much at home. This coming Sunday we celebrate the feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. I am always happy to talk about our Mother Mary who was instrumental for our redemption. So, I would like to write a short story of Our Lady of Mount Carmel.

There is a tradition—which may not be historical—that Mary appeared to Saint Simon Stock, a leader of the Carmelites, and gave him a scapular, telling him to promote devotion to it. The scapular is a modified version of Mary’s own garment. It symbolizes her special protection and calls the wearers to consecrate themselves to her in a special way. The scapular reminds us of the gospel call to prayer and penance—a call that Mary models in a splendid way. Hermits lived on Mount Carmel near the Fountain of Elijah in northern Israel in the 12th century. They had a chapel dedicated to Our Lady. They soon celebrated a special Mass and Office in honor of Mary. In 1726, it became a celebration of the universal Church under the title of “Our Lady of Mount Carmel”. For centuries the Carmelites have seen themselves as specially related to Mary.

Saint Teresa of Avila called Carmel “the Order of the Virgin.” Saint John of the Cross credited Mary with saving him from drowning as a child, leading him to Carmel, and helping him escape from prison. Saint Thérèse of the Child Jesus believed that Mary cured her from illness. On her First Communion day, Thérèse dedicated her life to Mary. During the last days of her life, she frequently spoke of Mary. By the 13th century the Carmelites became known as “Brothers of Our Lady of Mount Carmel.” The title suggests that they saw Mary not only as “mother,” but also as “sister.” The word *sister* is a reminder that Mary is very close to us. She is the daughter of God and therefore can help us be authentic daughters and sons of God. She also can help us grow in appreciation of being sisters and brothers to one another. She leads us to a new realization that all human beings belong to the family of God. When such a conviction grows, there is hope that the human race can find its way to peace.

## Eucharistic Revival: July 16th

### A Minute with Jesus ~ The Eucharist is called the Memorial of the Lord's Death and Resurrection

Jesus instructed the Apostles at the Last Supper to "do this in memory of Me." The Eucharist is a memorial, but this means much more than recalling something to mind, or remembering an event from the past. At Mass, the Death and Resurrection become present and real so that our lives may be conformed to them. "When the Church celebrates the Eucharist, She commemorates Christ's Passover [Jesus passing over from death to life], and it is made present: the sacrifice of Christ offered once for all on the Cross remains ever present" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, paragraphs 1363, 1364). Let's pray this right now and every day this week: *"Jesus, please help me to prepare beforehand to enter into the Memorial – the making present – of Your Death and Resurrection at Mass."* This week, read how St. Paul describes the Last Supper, capturing Jesus' words: *"Do this in remembrance of Me"* in 1 Corinthians 11:23-26.
