FROM OUR PASTOR

Two powerful stories from the Shalom Tidings magazine:

"One Sunday morning a young priest stood by the doors greeting the people of the parish where he was newly appointed. After a while of his busy day, the priest knelt before the altar. It was then he noticed an old lady still inside the church and making the way of the Cross. Upon meeting the chaplain he asked about the praying lady. 'She is a very pious lady; every morning she comes early to Church, leads the Rosary and the novena to Sacred Heart of Jesus. And after the Holy Mass, she also makes the way of the Cross, kneeling at every station and praying so ardently that I often feel, could anyone be so close to God's heart?'

The young priest began to watch her closely. While the old lady, was making the way of the Cross, he saw that she was not kneeling at the fifth station. Instead taking long strides she walked to the next. Curious enough the priest observed this same ritual at the fifth station every day. He wondered, Does she not like Simeon carrying the Cross for Jesus?'

The priest could not contain his curiosity and one day asked the old lady what was hindering her from kneeling at the fifth station. The reply was spontaneous 'Oh! That particular piece of bronze cross was contributed by John, my nasty neighbor.' The priest stood lost in words. Many a times, we ourselves are in place of that old pious lady. What is really in our heart--grudge, hatred or envy? If yes, then our long hours of prayer, fasting or almsgiving bear no fruit. Let's make a resolution to follow Jesus through the way of the Cross, not going through the motions alone but with a heart piecced with love."

"Shortly after they got married in 1956, Mr. and Mrs. Kuroki moved to a dairy farm in rural Japan. They lived a happy life raising two lovely children. One day, something unexpected went wrong with Mrs. Kuroki's sight. A week later, she was blind due to diabetes complications. She soon became depressed and withdrawn, secluding herself in the family home.

Mr. Kuroki struggled to find a way to cheer his wife until a beautiful idea struck him: he began to plant flowers in their dairy farm. After two years of hard work, the farm turned into a beautiful garden of thousands of scented flowers. Mrs. Kuroki could not remain in her shell as the sweet smell of the flowers drew her to the garden. She then understood her husband's love and all his years of work just to make her happy. This garden now draws people from around the world. They go to admire the real beauty of a love story that culminated into a marvelous sight.

Just like the blind wife, we also might be in our own shell of fear, depression or loneliness. Life might not be enjoyable during troubling times. Yet, our 'true love' is always working hard to bring us out of our cocoons. With the sweet, scented smell of His goodness and love, Jesus, always beckons us to the beautiful, eternal garden that He has made. We witness this through the love and charity among people, even those in the midst of darkness and atrocities.

When the earth's veil falls from our eyes, we will clearly see and enjoy the beautiful gift God has prepared for those He loves."

With new eyes let us look more deeply into our hearts and at the world God gives us.

Community Sharing Food Pantry News ~ The pantry is once again accepting deliveries of donated food. There are 2 criteria: They are only accepting food on Tuesdays at noon AND you must call to talk to Kathy about this BEFORE you come with your donation.

The pantry is also looking for help with:

1) They may be needing more volunteers in the fall once school resumes or, at the least, they will be needing subs.

2) Do you have a pick-up truck and would be willing to drive to Tomah, pick up food and bring it back to the pantry? They now have a 12' covered trailer. This has 1 axle and can hold 2,000#. This will be used for picking up food in Tomah once or twice a month early on Tuesday mornings. You need to have a current valid driver's license and insurance on your vehicle.

3) Could you drop food at anyone's home during this crisis? Or do you know someone that has health or age issues and needs this service at this time?
