FROM OUR PASTOR

Wrapping up National NFP (Natural Family Planning) Awareness Week I would like to offer you the following taken from the "Procreation & Responsible Parenthood" article written by Donald P. Asci, professor of Theology at Franciscan University, husband and father of six children. This was presented in the magazine Catechetical Review, a very good and heavy magazine that provides a wonderful opportunity to grow in the faith for adults. I encourage you to check out their website and the articles you find there.

"Procreation means providing to new life what neither God nor nature can provide. If God provides the human soul and nature provides the physiological processes of conception, then the human role in creating life entails making the choice to unleash the natural forces that lead to conception while providing the proper context for the life-giving creative power of God.

The concept of man and woman providing the appropriate context for the transmission of life centers on the idea of the requirement of human dignity and justice to all involved (man, woman, and child). It means participating in both natural and divine creative power in a way specifically suited to humans, rather than animals, while ensuring the affirmation of the dignity of all the humans involved. Based on the TOB (theology of the Body) understanding of the human person, only love can fulfill the requirements of justice in the affirmation of human dignity. Therefore, only when they release the natural forces that lead to conception as an act of love (toward each other and the possible child) can man and woman truly procreate."

The whole article is three pages long, filled with encouragement and depth to reflect on how we and God team together to bring about a new life. This new life begins in the womb yet is meant to enter life here in the world so to prepare for life in the world to come. Our actions with God's grace have eternal implications. It is easy and even tempting to see things only with this world in view. Still, God is always calling us to more and to see with His eyes and love with His Sacred Heart beyond what is immediately in front of us.

Seeing more deeply with God's eyes is the life of Blessed Herman the Cripple. "Herman was born with a cleft palate, spina bifida, and cerebral palsy. His physical limitations, however, were not able to mask his genius. When he was seven years old, his parents entrusted him to the care of a learned abbot for his education. Herman spent the rest of his life at the abbey of Reichenau, in southern Germany. He seems to have been blessed with the photographic memory that sometimes accompanies cerebral palsy, as well as the determination and humility that characterizes so many who carry the burden of disability.

Confined to a carry chair and dependent on others for movement, he also had difficulty speaking and writing. Yet he became a popular teacher, drawing many students from all over. Adept not only in theology but also in mathematics, music, language and history, it is said that his good cheer and humility made everyone love him.

Herman was also an artist who wrote theological verse and beautiful music. The Blessed Mother was ever his beloved patron. She helped him to bear physical sufferings, and brought him spiritual peace. In her honor, Herman is thought to have written the Salve Regina." (The Magnificat Magazine July 2022.) His parents unleashed the human and divine creative powers bringing him to life. Seeing only his limitations many could have felt sorry for him yet he has left us music that a 1,000 years later still glorifies God and His plan of salvation.


