TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARTY TIME

FROM OUR PASTOR

Tomorrow is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is a great feast but not a required Holy Day this year as it falls on a Monday. Yet for the great feast we will be offering the healing Mass at 10:30. It has been awhile since we have been able to gather to invoke the healing power of God and offer the Anointing of the Sick at Mass. Asking our Lady's intercession on this feast day is a great means of grace. Her Son Jesus is the Divine Physician and came to heal us from sin but drove out illness while here on earth. We invite all who are in need of an anointing to attend. I would include those preparing for upcoming surgeries. Caregivers are invited to receive a blessing for their service to the sick. For all who gather, a luncheon will be served by the PCCW of our parish following Mass.

Looking to another mother's encouragement I offer the following quotes from Mother Teresa:

"God loves me. I'm not here just to fill a place, just to be a number. He has chosen me for a purpose. I know it."

"I am a little pencil in the hand of a writing God who is sending a love letter to the world."

"I used to believe that prayer changes things, but now I know that prayer changes us, and we change things."

"The beginning of prayer is silence. If we really want to pray we must first learn to listen, for in the silence of the heart God speaks. And to be able to see that silence, to be able to hear God we need a clean heart; for a clean heart can see God, can hear God, can listen to God; and then only from the fullness of our heart can we speak to God. But we cannot speak unless we have listened, unless we have made that connection with God in the silence of our heart."

"God doesn't require us to succeed, He only requires that you try."

"When Jesus was dying on the Cross, He said: 'I thirst.' Jesus is thirsting for our love, and this is the thirst we all have, rich and poor alike. We all thirst for the love of others, that they go out of their way to avoid harming us and do good to us. This is the true meaning of true love, to give until it hurts."

"If someone feels that God wants him to transform social structures, that's an issue between him and his God. We all have the duty to serve God where we feel called. I feel called to help individuals, to love each human being. I never think in terms of crowds in general but in terms of each individual person. Were I to think about crowds, I would never begin anything. It is the person that matters. I believe in person to person encounters."

Both of these mothers want us to know eternal joy. Their words and actions can help us and putting their examples and words into practice will be of eternal assistance to us. We know our world is broken and in need of healing. Perhaps too we all need to see the brokenness in our own hearts, big or small. That we have very little silence and do not make the space for it in the busyness of our lives. Summer is growing shorter but I encourage you to find or make that time to find the joy God wants you to experience. Reach out to whatever and whoever can be of assistance to you in the areas that you need healing. Reach out also on the spiritual level for healing and strength. Mary has gone before us, shown us that the gates of eternal joy are open to us. Mother Teresa witnessed that joy, that love of neighbor to each person that she met.

Mary, pray for us! St. Teresa of Calcutta, pray for us!




