

August 15, 2021 THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

FROM OUR PASTOR

The Feast of the Assumption, celebrated every year on August 15, is a very old feast of the Church. It commemorates Mary's bodily assumption into Heaven. Because it signifies the Blessed Virgin's passing into eternal life, it is the most important of all Marian feasts and a Holy Day of Obligation for Roman Catholics. Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Mother reminds us that Christ has come, as he says in John's Gospel, to bring us "life, and life in all its abundance" (John 10:10). He has come with divine power to rule all the nations. Jesus will use his power to give each of his faithful followers the abundance of eternal life in heaven.

The first one to receive this gift, proving that this is true, was his most perfect disciple: his Mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary. When her earthly days were over because her mission was completed, Jesus assumed her, lifting her up body and soul, directly into heaven. The special miracle of the Assumption means to give us renewed hope and comfort amid the difficulties of our earthly pilgrimage. Mary really is our spiritual Mother, we are her children who can look to her for inspiration, help and guidance.

To honor our Mother, who was honored by her Son in such a special way, is our duty. We must understand that true devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary, a real devotion to Mary, consists of imitating her virtues; most especially her faith, humility, and obedience to God. She was the "handmaid of the Lord" who received special graces for believing in God's words and fulfilling them with lowliness. We must strive to resemble her spiritually.

We, too, must serve God and people. We, too, must do His will. Saint John Paul II was a great lover of the Blessed Mother. He prayed the Rosary. It has been a favorite prayer that helped him grow closer to God.
