FROM OUR PASTOR

The "That Man Is You" program offers wisdom to fathers and men in general to get men fully involved in family life. It is designed to build up marriages because it builds up men to be better husbands. Our program here at the parish ended when it was not possible for our group to gather anymore. But their encouragement is still there and I offer one of the sections from last Lent, it is entitled "Be truly present to your family." 'Being present' applies to all parents in a special way and reminder for all family members.

"We have seen that at Nazareth, Christ lived something like a Eucharistic presence. He didn't teach or preach or work amazing miracles. He was simply present and that presence transformed the home at Nazareth into the Temple of God.

This is called to be your mystery. You are called to be present in your homes. Your presence is itself the most important thing. Indeed, social science has uncovered the profound importance of the presence of the father in the home: better grades, greater educational attainment, lower crime, lower substance abuse issues, lower promiscuity, lower teenage pregnancies, fewer abortions, greater involved in the spiritual life. Your presence is vitally important to the home. Indeed, your presence helps to give life to the home.

Don Bosco clearly perceived this reality. He made the presence of the father the foundation of his Preventive Method: "The pupils should at all times be under the vigilant eye of the Rector, who like loving fathers can...place the pupils in the impossibility of committing faults." (Don Bosco, The Preventive Method). The Salesians of Don Bosco say that the continual presence of the rector in the life of the students is the most difficult aspect of the Preventive Method, Nonetheless, Don Bosco was adamant regarding this requirement."

Being there for family and friends can make all the difference. Time is our greatest gift that God has given us and what we can give to each other. With family, do we hoard our time as ours? Is there a balance for the time that we need to recharge or pray and the time that others need from us? The Eucharist is God's small, silent presence that can feed us, build us up and prepare us so we are ready to spend eternity with Him.

Let us not underestimate what our presence and gift of time can do. Let us not underestimate what a smile can do. Enjoy the following.
