As he sat in prison and anticipated a cruel and untimely death, St. Paul refused to give into negativity. He implored others to "have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God."

When we set our sights on the good, the demons are forced to flee. Fr. Ripperger has seen this happen with the possessed people he has worked with, but it can work for all of us.

We should all make positivity a part of our everyday spiritual lives. Join Chris and find out how to do just that.

Getting to know Jesus Christ in a deeper way: Reading the Catechism in 10 months ~ We grow in our love for someone as we get to know them better. Would you like to grow in your love for Jesus Christ through coming to know Him better? Reading the Catechism, a few pages each day, will help you deepen your understanding of His incredible love for you. A modest schedule of 15 paragraphs per night (roughly 3 pages) has been arranged that will take about 10-15 minutes of reflective reading, 5 nights a week over 38 weeks.
