My dear brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus, Praise be to the Lord. Welcome back to the newly renovated church. We are all so delightful to be back in our beautiful church. We did have a wonderful opening and blessing of our church on Friday, September 1, 2023. It was so overwhelming. The new thing during the ceremony was honor guard, which many of you haven't seen before. You see them often at high-profile Catholic events, standing in formation, swords at attention, the colorful hats, uniforms and capes a vibrant contrast to an otherwise ordinary congregation.

"The fourth degree of the Knights of Columbus is the patriotic degree, and that is where the honor guard comes from," said John Hundiak, a master of the Fourth Degree for Michigan District No. 1, the Fr. Hennepin Province. "It pertains to the role of the Catholic religion and its history in this country and its place in the future. The Guard of Honor has its origins at Calvary, its foundation in the Wounded Heart of Jesus, its model in the first 'Guard of Honor:' the **Blessed Virgin Mary**, **Saint John**, and **Saint Mary Magdalene**. They were the ones who stood by the abandoned Cross when the Heart of Christ was pierced by the lance."


