FROM OUR PASTOR

We are getting back into things. This week was our first school Mass. To start things off with Mary on her birthday was a great celebration. The PCCW is meeting again on a regular basis. Forming habits takes time and effort, getting into the swing of things also takes focus. So perhaps this is the time of the year to look at starting something that will help you grow in the faith. I encourage you to watch the bulletin for options. There are always resources on FORMED that you can use at any time.

This weekend is our Fall Festival. I encourage you to stop by. We have grown it since last year. Like many things there are a few tweaks that we have done so we can enjoy more activities. Check out the on-line auction. We will have some people available to help you get on-line and bid on some great items.

Looking ahead we have some great saints to inspire us. The wonderful story of St. Peter Claver. In Cartagena he welcomed the slaves that were being brought to the New World. The slave trade had been condemned by Pope Paul III and by Pope Pius IX. St. Peter served all he could, baptizing over 300,000 souls and caring for their bodily needs also.

We will also celebrate the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. As Christians this is a powerful feast recalling the very means of our salvation. A concrete expression of God's love for us; a sacrificial love that does not count the cost. Following the next day is the feast of Our Lady of Sorrows. It recalls the sufferings that Mary went through, her heart with the heart of Jesus. God and Mary know suffering and loss. Often we forget that, thinking what have they gone through since they are in heaven.

On Saturday we as a nation recall the events of 9/11/01. 9/11 means something and was a moment that things changed. The tragedy and loss continues to impact families. But we find ourselves 20 years later and our nation is in great need of prayer. Many people may have many thoughts about that event and reasons why or how or who to blame. But the need for healing and prayer should be clear to everyone.

Other saints we may recall could be the North American Martyrs, like St. John de Brébeuf (1593-1649). He wrote the following prayer. "Father, you consecrated the first beginnings of the faith in North America by the preaching and martyrdom of Saints John and Isaac and their companions. By the help of their prayers may the Christian faith continue to grow throughout the world. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, God forever and ever. Amen."

The Gospels are full of references to the prayers of Christ, including these examples:

- "After he had dismissed them, he went up on a mountainside by himself to pray." -Matthew 14:23
- "Then Jesus went with his disciples to a place called Gethsemane, and he said to them, 'Sit here while I go over there and pray.'" -Matthew 26:36
- "Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where he prayed." -Mark 1:35
- "But Jesus often withdrew to lonely places and prayed." -Luke 5:16
- "One of those days Jesus went out to a mountainside to pray, and spent the night praying to God." -Luke 6:12

"Then Jesus told his disciples a parable to show them that they should always pray and not give up." -Luke 18:1

Jesus loved His Father and communicated with Him often. He prayed for wisdom and guidance in His earthly ministry. He prayed for others to come to know Him as Savior and Lord. He prayed for the twelve disciples, that God would protect them from "the evil one." Jesus prayed for God to strengthen their ministry once He departed from them. He prayed with honesty and reverence. He prayed with joy and praise. But most of all, Jesus prayed with expectation. He knew the Father heard His prayers and would respond.

Jesus always prayed with passion, because He knew who it was He was talking to and He knew that prayer to the Father is a powerful thing and not something to take lightly and glibly.
