Five Fingers Prayer

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus!

Greetings from Fr. Cruz. I hope you've had some time to unwind and recharge during fall festival. I wanted to take a moment personally to thank you for your incredible efforts in making the event a success. From the beginning, it was clear that we had a great team of passionate individuals who were committed in making this event unforgettable. Your creativity, professionalism, and tireless work behind the scene truly made all the difference. Thank you again for everything that you have done. Today I like to teach you about the importance of five fingers prayer. This is beautiful and it is surely worth making the **five-finger prayer** a part of our lives.

- 1. **Your thumb** is nearest you. So, begin your prayers by praying for those closest to you. They are the easiest to remember. To pray for our loved ones is a 'sweet duty.'
- 2. The next finger is the pointing finger. Pray for those who teach, instruct and heal. This includes teachers, doctors, and ministers. They need support and wisdom in pointing others in the right direction. Keep them in your prayers.
- 3. The next finger is the tallest finger. It reminds us of our leaders. Pray for the president, leaders in business and industry, and administrators. These people shape our nation and guide public opinion. They need God's guidance.
- 4. **The fourth finger is our ring finger.** Surprising to many is the fact that this is our weakest finger, as any piano teacher will testify. It should remind us to pray for those who are weak, in trouble or in pain. They need your prayers day and night.
