

# September 16, 2018 TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

#### FROM OUR PASTOR:

Wow, what great weather. After all that rain, sunshine!! What a great thing to have for our Fall Festival. I hope you had a great time, I know I did. So many wonderful activities and so many wonderful people who did all that hard work behind the scenes to make everything turn out so well. A big thank you to all.

I would also like to highlight Catholic Charities and all that they do. Their summary for the year includes \$371,174 for basic human needs that they were able to provide. They had 1,498 volunteers that were there for others in their time of need. They were able to offer 25,217 sheltered nights in community homeless facilities. Those are facilities that we do not have here in Mauston and yet we get calls for those nights and the need for somewhere to stay. 63,296 hours of service were provided to adults and students through the Disability Services program. 42 children were helped to find families through the adoption programs that are offered. Of course those are just some of the programs and basics that Catholic Charities offers. Another area of help is their flood relief efforts and other natural disaster efforts that they coordinate long after many national groups have rounded up their efforts and have moved on.

A thought from Fr. Jacob Restrick on approaching others and not judging a book by its cover. "Toothless Tessie, that's me name,' she said beaming a toothless smile. I was a tourist out for movie stars on the corner of Hollywood and Vine, when Toothless Tessie came up to me and asked for a cigarette. I didn't have a cigarette, but I smiled back and asked her what her name was. We chatted like old friends meeting by chance in Hollywood. Tessie wanted to be an actress fifty years ago 'before I lost me teeth!' she exclaimed with a toothless laugh.

I gave Tessie ten dollars toward a pack of cigarettes which she graciously accepted, blessed me for it, and promised to pray for me. "I'm in the middle of a novena to St. Theresa, me patron saint,' she informed me with nonchalant certitude. "What are you praying for?' I asked. "To quit smoking; it is too darn expensive."

I laughed at the incongruity of it all, and Tessie laughed with me. I learned in that brief encounter that Tessie was a daily communicant and made a holy hour of Eucharistic adoration every afternoon. She lived in a cardboard box. But she was getting by. I watched her two-step down the street and waved goodbye."

We know our own situation well. What lies in our own hearts. Yet to look at others, we don't know where they have been or what may overwhelm their hearts. Situations do not always define us or others. A Fall Festival is a great time to celebrate, Catholic Charities is there when times are more challenging but often it is the daily events and crosses that people need us to stop, to listen, and to be present with them.
