

September 18, 2022 TWENTY FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FROM OUR PASTOR

Many find it hard to pray at times. Others find themselves distracted often. Sometimes there are tools that can help us focus or root us in prayer. Fr. Peter John Cameron, O.P. wrote the following "A Gospel Litany of Faith". Perhaps it can give you the life of Jesus to focus on and the responses may direct you in a way of living out the faith. Desiring to live the faith joyfully can happen with the help of the Holy Spirit. Ask His help even before beginning to pray.

***Lord Jesus,

Once the shepherds saw you in the manger, they left proclaiming the Good News to the world. -May your presence move me to live by faith. On the storm-tossed sea, you called Peter to come to you, walking across the water. -Rid me of fear-save my faith from faltering. When blind Bartimaeus begged you for sight, you declared, "Your faith has healed you." -Give me the vision and the insight of true faith. When the woman with a hemorrhage touched your hem you said "Your faith has cured you." -Make my faith stronger than any dread or worry. Jairus knelt before you in belief, begging you to come and raise his daughter from her deathbed. -Let me live this truth: what is needed is trust. To the lame man by the Sheep Pool you asked "Do you want to be healed?" -Help me to believe in your desire to heal me. You marveled at the widow's mite because she gave more than all who donated great sums. -Make my life one of a total gift of self in faith. Struck with wonder at his healing, the leper returned to you; his faith was his salvation. -Let my faith be marked by humility and thanks. When the centurion saw your suffering , he confessed, "This man was the Son of God." -May my suffering lead to deeper faith. When you saw the faith of the men carrying the stretcher of the paralytic, you healed him. -May my faith bear fruit for the world.

Another aspect of prayer is what to pray for? At first that may seem easy and many ideas come to mind. Other times not so much. Or part of it is looking at our intention to see why am I praying for that? Will it bring my heart closer to the heart of Jesus? Am I asking out of self centeredness? Or vanity? Or even pride? Getting past the surface and delving more deeply in prayer we may see things we didn't realize. That immediate 'wants' may give way to what God wants for us. Yes it's heaven. But look to the saints and the many different roads that they took to get there. Are we open to any of those roads in general or the very specific road that God has planned for us.

It's true, prayer is not always easy. We can get distracted or try to go in the direction we want to go. Maybe out of faith and in trust let the Holy Spirit guide you the next time you pray.


